Designed Buildings in Riverdale

Simon B. Zelnick, a New York architect, died Thursday at Montefiore Hospital in the Bronx. He was 86 years old.

Mr. Zelnick, who taught architecture at New York University, won recognition for the design of a number of buildings in Riverdale, the Bronx, including the Riverdale Temple and the Riverdale Jewish Center. He also designed the Motion Picture Fine Arts Theater in Manhattan.

He won the Cooper Union Award in Architectural Design in 1922, 1923 and 1951.
