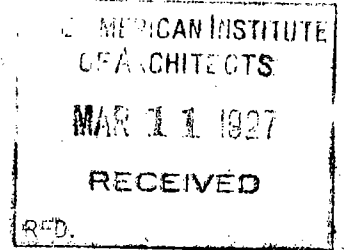

Dear Mr. Saxe:

Yours of March 9th is the first information we have had concerning Mr. Zimmerman, and the fact that he has been in California for so long a period. He has been paying his Institute dues annually and there is no charge against him, except for the current year.

Is it possible that he is eligible for retirement? Retirement provisions are set out in the By-laws of the Institute - Article 5, Section 1, (see page 105 of the Annuary).

Retirement involves no change in status as an active member except the remission of the annual dues.

It seems quite probable that Mr. Zimmerman is eligible for retirement, and in that event he should make application direct to the Institute.

If not eligible then a resignation should be sent in through the Secretary of the Chicago Chapter - Mr. C. W. Farrier, of 80 E. Jackson Boulevard, Chicago. (See the procedure indicated on the marked extract sent herewith.)

Until some action is taken in this regard we must continue to send monthly bills to Mr. Zimmerman, and would appreciate it if you would write again in view of the above.

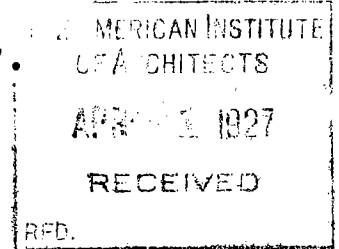
