Please note in paragraphs 3 and 10, we are advised that we would receive full deposit refund, but to date have only received \$33.00 as per copy of the enclosed refund ticket.

deposit would be used to defray his costs, which is certainly not the purpose of a deposit.

While the money involved is rather trivial, this practice of trying to keep deposits occurs occasionally in the building industry and we would like to discourage it, since no ethical architect will operate in this manner. Please advise us if any steps can be taken in this matter.

### INSTRUCTIONS TO SIDDERS

Before submitting a proposal, bidders should carefully examine the trawings and specifications, visit the site of the building, examine the existing buildings and fully inform themselves as to all existing conditions and limitations, and shall include in the proposal a sum to ever the cost of all items included in the contract.

Proposals to be entitled to consideration must be made in accordance with the following instructions:

- The Owner reserves the right to reject any or all bids, and to award the contract to whom and in such manner as he may see fit.
- All addends or bulletins issued during the period of preparing bids shall be covered in the proposal and in closing a contract, they shall become a part thereof. The general, structural and mechanical drawings are co-operative and the contractor shall examine each and include all work shown or called for under his division of the work.
- Plans and specifications may be secured of the Architect. A deposit of Sixty (\$60.00) is required, the full amount of which will be refunded with deductions not exceeding the actual cost of reproduction and mailing upon return of all documents in good condition at the time the bid is submitted Deposit will not be returned to the successful bidder
- he Fach bidder shall sign the proposal giving his mame, address and status; that is, "Individual", "Partnership", or "Corporation".
- Work on this project may be commenced at once upon swerd of contracts. Contractors may, if they so desile, postpone leart of actual operations wastlessed to state in their proposals the length of time after starting they will require for the completion of this project, which statement may be taken into consideration in awarding contract. Contractors responsible for delays except for labor strikes or other causes beyond said Contractor's control, shall be liable for liquidated damages of \$100.00 per day for each and every day, Sundays excepted, asid building shall remain incompleted after the date of completion named in the contract. Failure to operate the work in accordance with the Progress Schedule will be sufficient cause for the cancellation of the Contract.


