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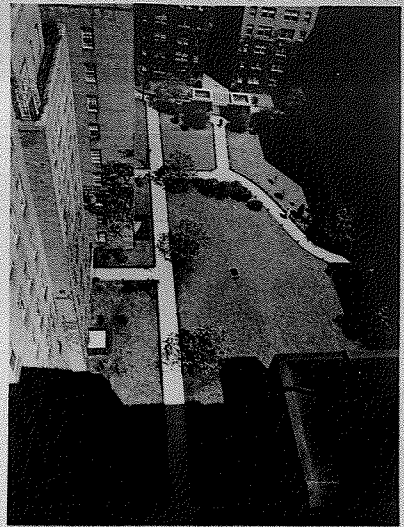

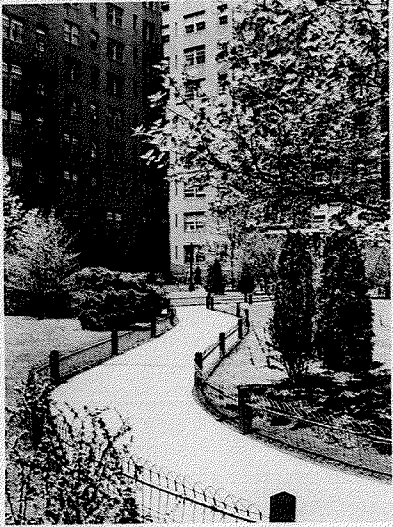

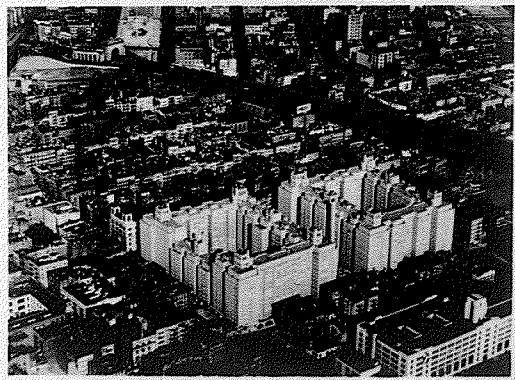

CORNER STREET ELEVATION - KINGSBOROUGH VILLAGE

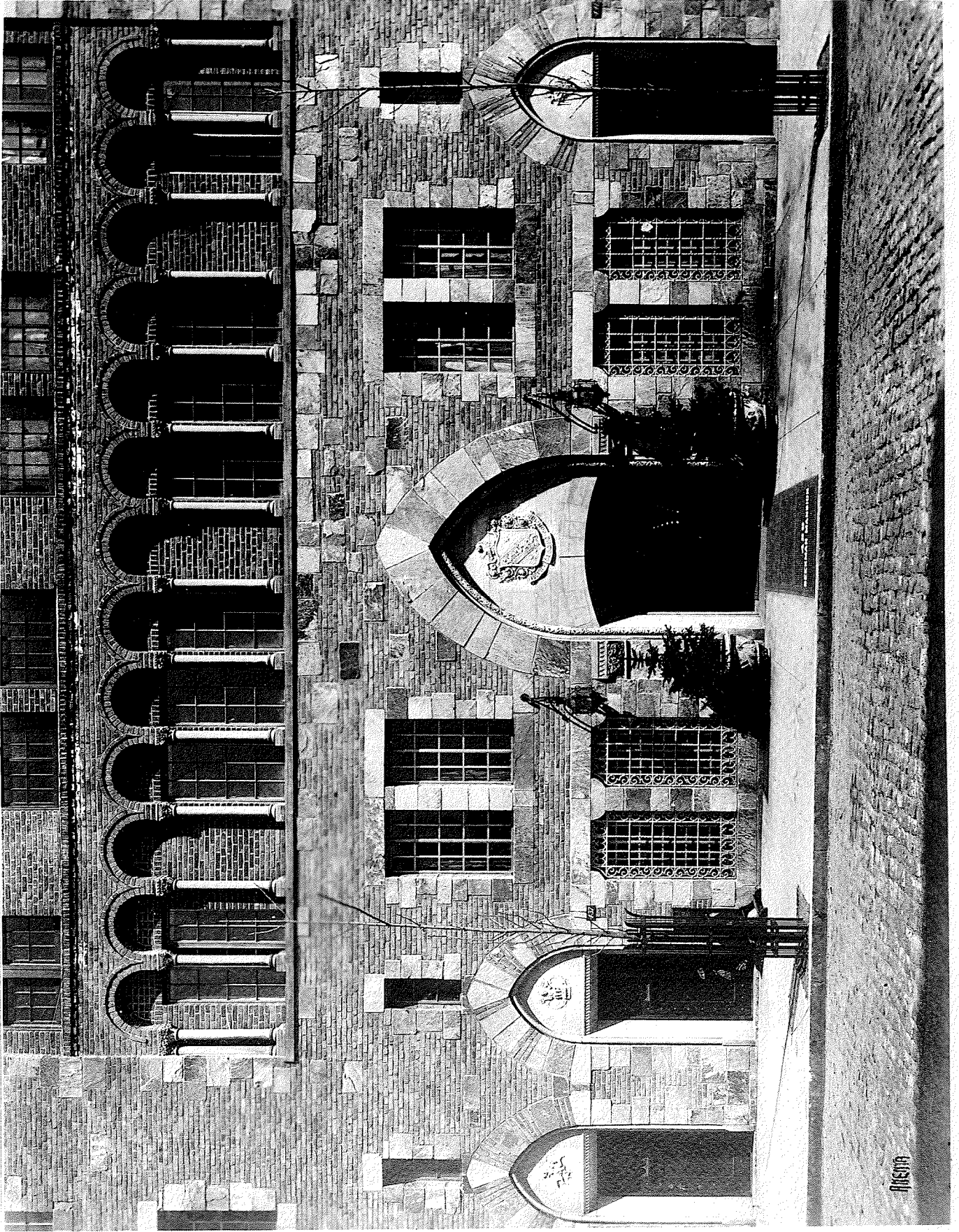


ENTRANCE TO EAST BUILDING - KINGSBOROUGH VILLAGE

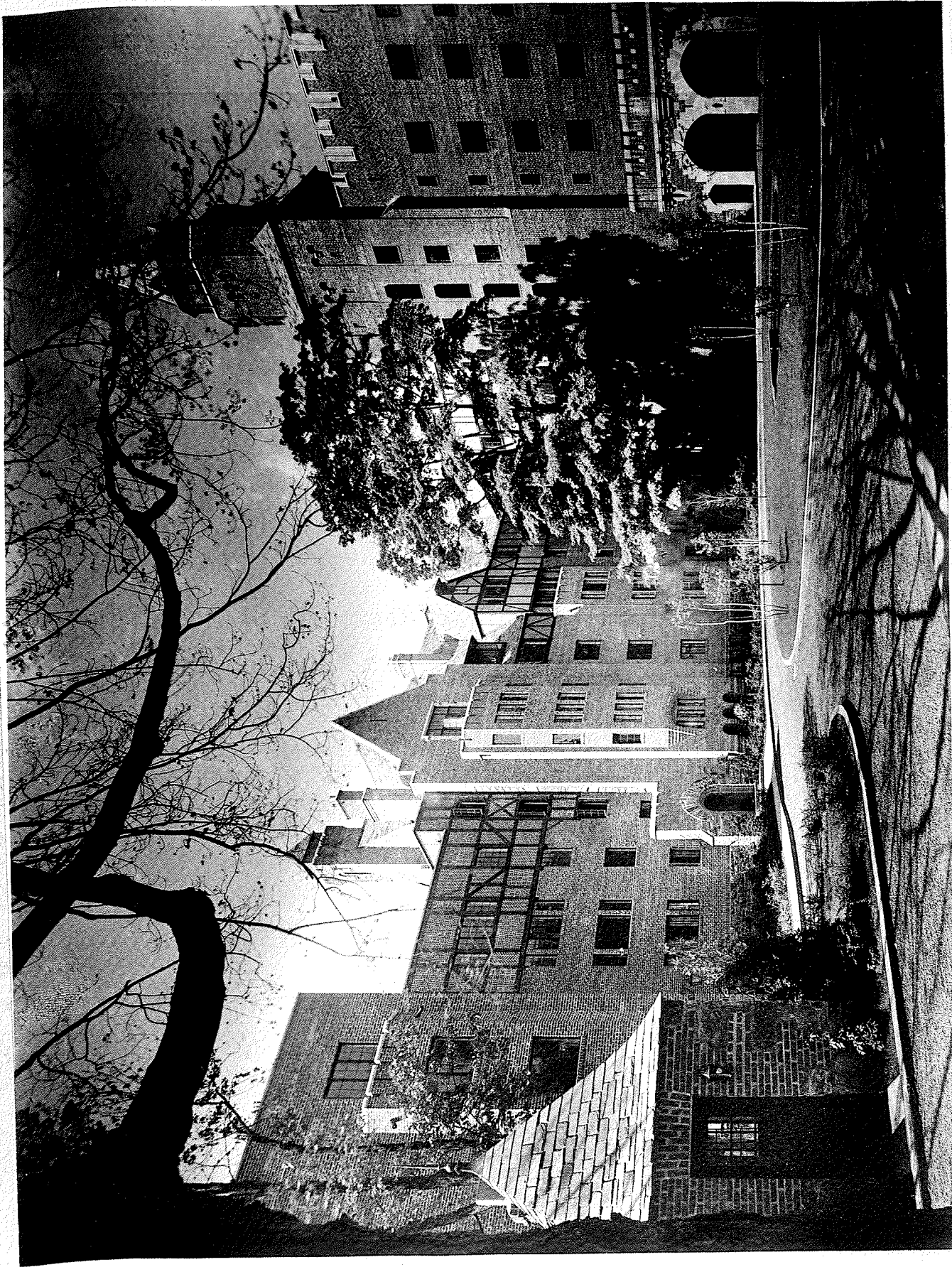


1934 VIEW - KINGSBOROUGH VILLAGE
