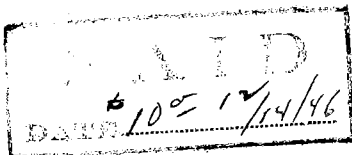


Dear Mr. Kemper:

This will acknowledge receipt of the notice of application for membership relative to Carl L. Cederstrand, dated Jan. 25, 1946; also copy of your letter of the same date directed to Mr. Cederstrand.

It was the opinion of the Executive Committee of the Chicago Chapter, taken at its last regular meeting, that the Chapter could not endorse Mr. Cederstrand's application, inasmuch as he is not duly registered as an architect in any state. The Chapter is unable to find any provision in the By-laws of the Institute whereby other than Registered Architects may become corporate members, and feels that a dangerous precedent might be set in accepting public officials as members who are not duly registered as architects.

This was in no sense a reflection upon Mr. Cederstrand or his professional ability and it was felt therefore that it would be in order for the Institute to suggest to Mr. Cederstrand the advisability (even for other reasons beyond those of Institute membership) of his becoming a Registered Architect in one or more states. Because of Mr. Cederstrand's experience, such registration would be available to him in many states without formal written examinations.

Dear Mr. Schlossman:

With further reference to your letter of February 7th and our reply of the 25th, concerning the application of Mr. Carl L. Cederstrand for corporate membership:

The application was reviewed by The Board of Examiners at its regular meeting here at The Octagon on March 5th, and the Chairman has requested that you be advised as follows:

The Board of Examiners would like to comply with your request. However, as there have been a number of cases in which applications of non-registered architects have been approved because they were public officials, teachers, etc., there does not seem to be sufficient reason, in the case of Mr. Cederstrand, to depart from the precedents thus established. Also, undoubtedly there are several cases which will come up in the future in which it might be embarrassing to require registration unless The Board of Examiners continues the present policy of approving such applications, subject to the final approval of The Board of Directors.

The rule of The Board of Directors governing in such cases is as follows:

Resolved, That a prerequisite for election to corporate membership in The Institute shall be the registration of applicants from all states which require registration or that they possess similar qualifications from states which do not have registration laws; and that any exceptions to this rule, such as applications from editors of architectural magazines or professors in schools of architecture, or others, shall be referred to The Board of The Institute for final action."

In view of the above, The Board of Examiners has approved the application of Mr. Cederstrand and recommends to The Board of Directors that favorable action be taken on it. It will be presented to The Board of Directors at its meeting on May 3 next, with your letter of February 7, 1946.
