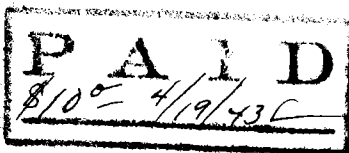





Dear Mr. Cellar:

This will notify you that we have received a charge of alleged unprofessional conduct filed against you by the Executive Committee of the Florida North Chapter, A.I.A., for violation of the Mandatory Rules of The American Institute of Architects relating to competing on the basis of fees for an award of contract for architectural work.

Enclosed are copies of the Procedure - Rules of The Board of Directors of the A.I.A. relating to charges of unprofessional conduct; and the Standards of Professional Practice under which the charge was filed.

You will note that the first step in the procedure will be by a hearing before the Executive Committee of the Florida North Chapter. However, in view of the fact that the alleged violation referred to by the Chapter Executive Committee is under investigation, and it will be necessary to await the outcome of the investigation before proceeding to hold hearings, the requirement of the Rule of The Board - paragraph (5) - that hearing must be held within twenty (20) days after the receipt of such charge, has been waived.

You will be notified, in due course, of the time and place of such hearing.

We call to your attention that the charge is privileged and all matters concerning the procedure and acts of the Chapter and The Judiciary Committee are confidential. You should treat the charge in like manner.

Dear Mr. Cellar:

The Judiciary Committee of The American Institute of Architects has received from the Executive Committee of the Florida North Chapter, A.I.A., the report on the hearing held by it on the charge of alleged unprofessional conduct filed against you for violation of the Mandatory Rules of The Institute, relating to competing on the basis of fees for an award of contract for architectural work.

Under the requirements of the Rules of The Board of Directors (copy of which you have) The Judiciary Committee is charged with the duty of holding a hearing in this matter, inasmuch as the Chapter Executive Committee has found that a prima facie case exists.

In the interests of expediting these charges and reducing the expenses of all concerned, The Judiciary Committee wishes to propose that the hearing before that Committee take place in Washington, D. C., immediately prior to the meeting of The Board of Directors of The Institute which will convene on March 3, 1952; and further, that in the event The Judiciary Committee should find the member guilty, the final hearing which must be held by The Board of Directors, be held at the immediately following meeting of The Board.

In order to accomplish this, it would be necessary to secure from each and every party concerned, an agreement to waive the required twenty-day notice of the hearing to be held by The Board of Directors, inasmuch as that Board hearing would be held immediately following the hearing by The Judiciary Committee.

If the above proposed plan does not meet with approval, The Judiciary Committee will be governed by the procedure to be followed when charges of unprofessional conduct are preferred, and will plan to hold hearings in Jacksonville, Florida, the latter part of January. Thereafter, in the event that the member is found to be guilty as charged, final hearing will be held by The Board of Directors in Washington, D.C., at the time of its meeting scheduled for March 3.

Will you kindly notify this office if you would be willing to waive the twenty-day notice required for hearing by The Board of Directors in order that the plan proposed by The Judiciary Committee to hold both meetings in March in Washington, D. C., may be carried out?




