

Charge: Violation of Mandatory Rules #3 and #15 -

"3. An Architect shall not knowingly compete with another Architect on a basis of professional charges, nor use donation as a device for obtaining competitive advantage."

"15. An Architect shall at no time act in a manner detrimental to the best interests of the profession."

Facts and Discussion:

During the latter part of October 1959, the Commissioners of the Court of Tarrant County, Texas, interviewed 14 Architects in connection with the proposed County Criminal Courts Building, after having issued an invitation to submit "bids." All but two of the interviewed Architects stated their fees at 6% which is considered normal for this type of work in the area. One of the two proposed a fee of $5\frac{1}{2}\%$ which he later withdrew, substituting a fee of 6%. The other, Mr. Birch D. Easterwood, A.I.A., quoted a fee of $4\frac{1}{2}\%$. He subsequently was awarded the work.

The "Fort Worth Press" of October 26, 1959, in an article commenting on the proposed building, stated in part:

"Judge Simpson also told Commissioners that Architect Birch D. Easerwood had submitted the lowest bid for designing plans for the addition and supervising construction. Mr. Easterwood agreed to do the work for $4\frac{1}{2}\%$ of the cost of building it. Judge Simpson said most Architects wanted 6%....."

Page 2 of the Judiciary Committee's Report is omitted due to confidentiality of evidential statements in judiciary hearings.

Report of The National Judiciary Committee Page #2

Following the appearance of the above article, another Architect, during a casual meeting with Mr. Easterwood, entered into a conversation concerning his fee. This Architect claims that Mr. Easterwood made the following remarks "in substance":

"I am tired of never getting any of the City or County work and I made up my mind to get this job. I found out that someone had made a 4-7/8% bid as well as a 5% proposal, so I bid $4\frac{1}{2}$ %. I just made up my mind that if a low bid is what it would take to get the work - then that is what I was going to quote."

The other Architect states that he then mentioned to Easterwood that this procedure was unethical and that charges could be filed against him. Easterwood is reported as saying:

"No one ever told me about that. I haven't been to the meetings, to begin with. I don't give a God damn what the Chapter does - I'm tired of being kicked around and never getting any of this public work. The Chapter can go to hell insofar as I am concerned."

In his digest of defense Mr. Easterwood denies that he made such statements; that he did not use the expression "God damn," nor that he said the Chapter could go to "hell." He also denies that he tried to cut under the "bids" of other Architects and claims the fee he quoted to be fair and reasonable for the work involved, inasmuch as (he claims) the "supervision and cost thereof was to be borne by the County....."

A review of the Agreement between Easterwood and the Commissioners fails to uphold his contention concerning the cost of supervision. Article #1 - "The Architects Services" - states: "The Architect's professional services consist of the necessary conferences, the preparation of preliminary studies, working drawings, specifications, large scale and full-size detail drawings, for architectural structural, plumbing, heating, electrical, jail cells, and other mechanical work; assistance in the drafting of forms of proposals and contracts; the issuance of certificates of payment; the general administration of the business and supervision of the Work." In addition, the Agreement provides that the Architect shall furnish the site survey and pay for borings, test pits and other tests if required.

Mr. Easterwood's reference to supervision probably relates to the Clerk-of-the-Works or "Project Inspector" as he is termed, whose salary is to be paid by the Owner.

Further, in a notarized statement submitted on behalf of Mr. Easterwood, a third party who was present during the conversation reported above, gives his own version of the remarks made by Easterwood. While this version is not strictly parallel to that reported by the "other Architect," there is enough similarity of the substance to lend credulance to the first.

The Regional Judiciary Committee finds a prima facie case of violations of Rules #3 and #15.
