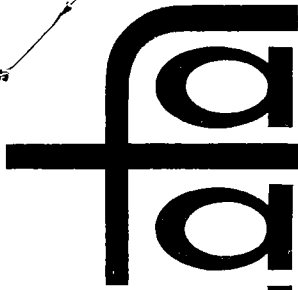

They are one and the same. We have no record of authorizing a transfer and believe that it was done on the basis of a Chapter arrangement, whereby Mr. Tucker is possibly paying dues to both Chapters.

We have no correspondence from the Central New York Chapter to substantiate this however, and in fact are still carrying Mr. Tucker at a New York address from which he has been paying his National Dues.
