





2. Describe nominee's notable work in design, to bring out the particular achievements the nominators believe have notably contributed to the advancement of the profession.

The nominee has been active in what is now termed the "Expanded Services of the Architect" since the beginning of his practice. In 1951, his firm was commissioned to act as Architects for the town of Fairless Hills, Pennsylvania. The nominee was partner-in-charge of an office located at the site His activities included coordination of planners, engineers, landscape architects and construction. He worked with the DuPont Company in the development of exterior paint colors to bring variety to the low cost housing built as part of this project. The nominee was responsible for the location and arrangement of all residential buildings and for the design of many of the major structures, such as Shopping Center, Bowling Alley, Service Station, State Police Quarters and Swimming Pool. Photographs of two of these structures have been submitted under Item 1, above.

In 1958, the nominee was partner-in-charge of planning for the first Urban Renewal Project to be executed in Columbus, as well as responsible for design of the major structures which are features of the plan. Photographs of these structures have been submitted under Item 1, above.



The nominee has been a member of the Builders Exchange of Columbus for 20 years. This organization is composed of all segments of the construction industry. The nominee served on the committee to construct new quarters for this organization, which includes a plan room available to all architects in the area.

The nominee has served on several other committees of the Exchange.

1. In 1961, the nominee assisted in the organization of the first Annual Construction Conference of the Builders Exchange; a one day meeting where seminars are held to discuss all aspects of the construction industry.





He served on the program committee in 1962, as speaker in 1963 and has assisted in subsequent years in having the viewpoint of the Architect well represented.

He served as a member of the Building Construction Coordinating Committee of Columbus. Charged with the issuance of recommendations for Industry Ethics and Procedures.

The nominee has been a member of the Construction Specifications Institute since 1948. He was a charter member and first President of the Columbus Chapter of this organization. He served two terms as President, 1957-1958, and as a member of the Board of Directors.

The nominee is currently a member of a Task Force of the American Iron and Steel Institute investigating transient vibrations in buildings. It is expected that recommendations of significant importance to the science of construction will be developed by this committee.

NOMINEE'S ACHIEVEMENTS IN SERVICE TO THE PROFESSION

1. The nominee has been an active member of the Columbus Chapter since his admission to the Institute in July 1945. A list of the offices held, and the committees on which he has served, follows:

While President of the Columbus Chapter, the nominee was able to arrange with the City of Columbus the acceptance of the Schedule of Recommended Fees of the Architects Society of Ohio, which represented an improvement over the fees previously paid by the City.

In 1963, the nominee was elected Second Vice President of the Architects Society of Ohio. At this time the affairs of the Society were in poor shape, and shortly thereafter the Executive Director resigned. The nominee was appointed a member of the committee to select a new Executive Director. The nominee worked with the officers to unravel the affairs of the Society, including the selection of, and worked with, a certified public accountant to establish sound budget and fiscal procedures.

The nominee served as Program Chairman of the 1965 Annual Meeting and is General Chairman for the 1966 Annual Meeting.

The nominee has represented the Chapter at meetings of:

- Ohio Meeting, Painting and Decorating Contractors of America.
- Producers Council.
- Apprenticeship Council Department of Industrial Relations, State of Ohio.
- Career Days, Board of Education, City of Bexley, Ohio.

The nominee was appointed a member of the Building Commission of the City of Columbus and served from 1958 to 1962. This commission is charged with the responsibility of administration and interpretation of the Building Code, as well as serving as a Board of Appeals from rulings of the various examining boards for licensing plumbers, heating contractors, refrigeration contractors and electrical contractors. The nominee served as the Architect member of this Board.

The nominee was appointed (upon recommendation of the Architects Society of Ohio) by the Governor as a member of the State Plumbing Advisory Board and served from 1962 to 1966. This Board acts as advisors to the Department of Health, State of Ohio, and is charged with the responsibility of reviewing materials and methods as well as recommendations to the Board of Building Standards for revisions to the Plumbing Code. While in this position, the nominee provided testimony to the City of Columbus which resulted in coordination of the City and State Codes which has permitted more economical construction.

Development Committee for Greater Columbus, This is a citizen's committee interested in all aspects of area development. The nominee has and is currently serving as a member of the Land Use Planning Committee.

Downtown Area Committee. In 1958, the nominee's office was one of three firms selected as architects for a new State Office Building. The nominee was partner-in-charge of a site selection study for the State Office Building Commission. Shortly thereafter the nominee became a member of the Downtown Area Committee, a citizens committee selected to work with the Mayor on a study of the core area of Columbus. This committee in turn worked with a panel of the Urban Land Institute which presented a report on the Innerbelt Area of Columbus.

The nominee's work on the State Office Site selection enabled him to supply much useful information to the panel. The panel's report was the start of the revitalization of the downtown area of Columbus which is still in progress.

The nominee is still a member of the Downtown Area Committee.

2. Describe nominee's notable work in design, to bring out the particular achievements the nominators believe have notably contributed to the advancement of the profession.

The nominee has been active in what is now termed the "Expanded Services of the Architect" since the beginning of his practice. In 1951, his firm was commissioned to act as Architects for the town of Fairless Hills, Pennsylvania. The nominee was partner-in-charge of an office located at the site. His activities included coordination of planners, engineers, landscape architects and construction. He worked with the DuPont Company in the development of exterior paint colors to bring variety to the low cost housing built as part of this project. The nominee was responsible for the location and arrangement of all residential buildings and for the design of many of the major structures, such as Shopping Center, Bowling Alley, Service Station, State Police Quarters and Swimming Pool. Photographs of two of these structures have been submitted under Item 1, above.

In 1958, the nominee was partner-in-charge of planning for the first Urban Renewal Project to be executed in Columbus, as well as responsible for design of the major structures which are features of the plan. Photographs of these structures have been submitted under Item 1, above.

While President of the Columbus Chapter, the nominee was able to arrange with the City of Columbus the acceptance of the Schedule of Recommended Fees of the Architects Society of Ohio, which represented an improvement over the fees previously paid by the City.

In 1963, the nominee was elected Second Vice President of the Architects Society of Ohio. At this time the affairs of the Society were in poor shape, and shortly thereafter the Executive Director resigned. The nominee was appointed a member of the committee to select a new Executive Director. The nominee worked with the officers to unravel the affairs of the Society, including the selection of, and worked with, a certified public accountant to establish sound budget and fiscal procedures.

The nominee served as Program Chairman of the 1965 Annual Meeting and was General Chairman for the 1966 Annual Meeting.

Achievements in Service to the Profession

The nominee is currently (1967) President of the Architects Society of Ohio and will direct the program for the Annual Meeting of the Society to be held in Columbus in mid-October. He is principally responsible for stimulating and organizing a seminar in Continuing Education which will precede the Annual Meeting and which, at this writing, will be a successful beginning of continuing professional studies in this Region.

The nominee was appointed a member of the Building Commission of the City of Columbus and served from 1958 to 1962. This commission is charged with the responsibility of administration and interpretation of the Building Code, as well as serving as a Board of Appeals from rulings of the various examining boards for licensing plumbers, heating contractors, refrigeration contractors and electrical contractors. The nominee served as the Architect member of this Board.

The nominee was appointed (upon recommendation of the Architects Society of Ohio) by the Governor as a member of the State Plumbing Advisory Board, and served from 1962 to 1966. This Board acts as advisors to the Department of Health, State of Ohio, and is charged with the responsibility of reviewing materials and methods as well as recommendations to the Board of Building Standards for revisions to the Plumbing Code. While in this position, the nominee provided testimony to the City of Columbus which resulted in coordination of the City and State Codes which has permitted more economical construction.

Development Committee for Greater Columbus. This is a citizen's committee interested in all aspects of area development. The nominee has and is currently serving as a member of the Land Use Planning Committee.

Downtown Area Committee. In 1958, the nominee's office was one of three firms selected as architects for a new State Office Building. The nominee was partner-in-charge of a site selection study for the State Office Building Commission. Shortly thereafter the nominee became a member of the Downtown Area Committee, a citizens committee selected to work with the Mayor on a study of the core area of Columbus. This committee in turn worked with a panel of the Urban Land Institute which presented a report on the Innerbelt Area of Columbus.

The nominee's work on the State Office Site selection enabled him to supply much useful information to the panel. The panel's report was the start of the revitablization of the downtown area of Columbus which is still in progress.

The nominee is still a member of the Downtown Area Committee.

Achievement in Public Service.

In the current year (1967) the nominee has served as vice-chairman of the Housing and Construction Task Group, Emergency Resources Management Plan, State of Ohio. Primary working responsibility was delegated to the vice-chairman. The nominee's fulfillment of his responsibility entailed careful organization of leaders in the Housing and Construction sector and resulted in a clear and workable plan. Quoting from an official summary from the Office of Emergency Planning, State of Ohio, dated 12 September 1967:

"There was general agreement that the State Plan was well conceived, adequate for use, and that the procedures outlined in the plans could be employed during emergency situations.....Such efforts should result in an up dated and ready-to-go Plan to assure Ohio's capabilities to function and manage resources under any contingency."
