

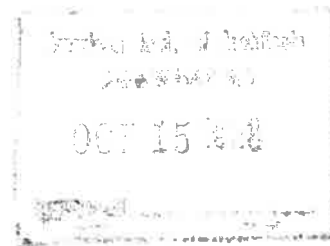

Dear Mr. Mead:

Replying to your letter of January 11 regarding the status of Mr. Henry H. Turner. According to Institute records, Mr. Turner's membership was discontinued December 31, 1935.

At that time, he was indebted to The Institute for dues for the period 1931 to 1933 - \$25.00, 1934 - \$15, and 1935 - \$15.00, a total of \$55.00.
