Dear Mr. Botsai

We have undertaken a special program to contact those chapter members recently terminated by national for non-payment of the \$10. special assessment. We wanted a personal contact with these members to learn why they chose not to remit a relative small amount of dues after repeated warnings of impending termination.

The effort was successful. Four of the "\$10, terminees", (names and addresses are given below), submitted checks to us in that amount. Our check for \$40 for these four is enclosed. (We learned that two others had already paid the \$10. and these are being handled separately.)

While these four individuals agreed to remit the delinquent dues, they strongly urged that their thoughts be passed on to national. Generally their overwhelming opinion was that in proportion to the benefits received the national dues are (State dues are tolerated and local dues are fairly well acceptsimply too high. ed--again, in comparison to benefits gained.) The \$10. charge was merely the breaking point in their relationship with national, and their refusal to pay was their way of protesting. Some expressed opposition to the program funded by There was further comment that everything national the \$10. assessment. does is too expensive -- from the new headquarters building down to the mailings.

So these members have returned to the Institute family, even though somewhat We think their comments represent a growing concern both locally--and, from what we read, nationally too--about the high cost of AIA membership.
