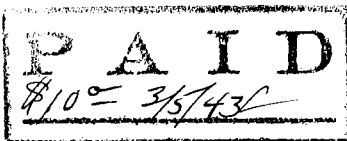

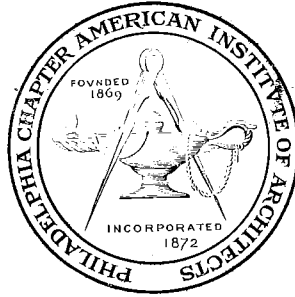


Your certificate of membership, duly executed by the Officers of The Institute, will be sent in due course.
