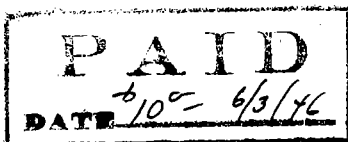

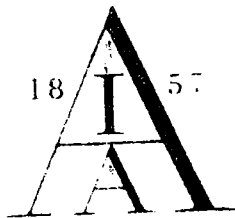


Dear Miss Gervais:
