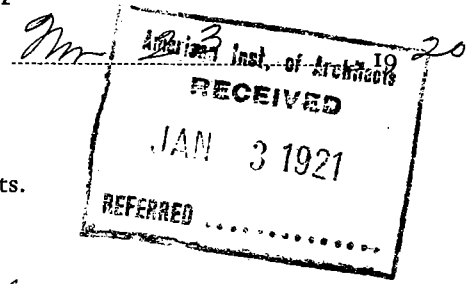

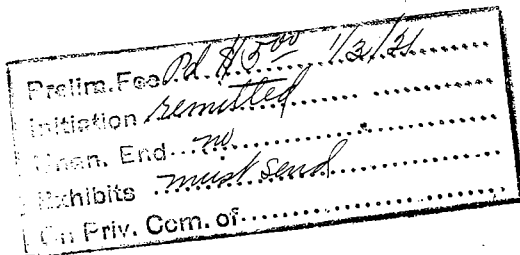

Dear Mr. Woolley:

Dear Mr. Woolley:

This is the first opportunity to acknowledge your remittance on account of Institute dues, and to thank you for the same.

The indebtedness remaining is \$25.00 for the year 1928, and, of course, there are the dues for the current year, as shown on the enclosed statement.

Under the By-Laws of the Institute the dues of each year must be paid during that year.

If view of your remittance we removed your name from the list of members whose memberships were discontinued as of December 31, 1928 for non-payment of dues.
