CATEGORY #1 - SERVICE TO THE PROFESSION

Mr. Wold has been a principal in A/E firms in Western Michigan since 1956. During this entire period, he has been an active leader in his community and his profession. Through his executive positions in NCARB, MSA, AIA, and state government, he has made significant contributions to the profession. He has also devoted countless hours to speeches, slide lectures, panel discussions and other public appearances designed to improve the understanding of Architecture by students, local governments, and the community at large.

He has been a member of the State Board of Architects since 1975; Chairman from 1979-81. He has a vital concern for the quality of education and apprenticeship for people entering the profession. During his Board Chairmanship, the I.D.P. Program was adopted by Michigan as certification for training experience, and the Michigan Registration Act was revised to include an Accredited Degree Requirement.

He served on the NCARB Procedures and Documents Committee which recommended the Accredited Degree Requirement for future holders of the National Certificate. He was Chairman of the NCARB Committee that worked in cooperation with AIA, NSPE, and B.O.C.A. to develop a national guideline describing projects which required professional design services and those which do not. Currently he is Assistant Coordinator of the Site Design Section of the Architectural Registration Examination Committee.

In his AIA activities, Mr. Wold has held most chapter offices in two AIA chapters; West Michigan and Grand Valley. He was a co-founder of Grand Valley in 1962. He has chaired most important chapter committees. Because of his work in these AIA offices, he was elected to the regional board in 1962 and advanced through all executive offices to Regional President of the Michigan Society of Architects in 1966.

During his terms as MSA Vice President and President, he established and funded a permanent regional staff and office in Detroit, and hired an architectural representation at the state capitol in Lansing.

HIGHLIGHTS OF MR. WOLD'S ACHIEVEMENTS

A. PERSONAL HONORS - 1982

Received Gold Medal Honor Award, Michigan Society of Architects

B. SCHOLARSHIP FUNDING - 1981-to date

Chairman of the Scholarship Committee of the Western Michigan Builders Exchange. Developed the idea that the Exchange could provide assistance to persons already committed to the construction industry to upgrade their skills in order to improve the quality of design and construction. This program was initiated in 1983 and has provided \$23,000 in two years to students attending Michigan colleges in programs related to the design and construction industry.

C. REGISTERED PROFESSIONAL REQUIREMENTS - 1980-81

Chairman of a Committee for NCARB in cooperation with AIA, NSPE, and the Building Officials Conference of America which developed a national legislative guideline describing projects which require professional design services and those which are exempt from this requirement.

D. EDUCATIONAL REQUIREMENTS - 1979-81

Served on the NCARB Procedures and Documents Committee which recommended the Accredited Degree Requirement for future holders of the National Certificate.

E. REGISTRATION BOARD CHAIRMAN - 1979-81

Adopted the I.D.P. Program as certification for training experience. Revised Michigan Registration Act to include accredited degree requirement.

F. AIA PRESIDENT - 1966

President of the Michigan Society of Architects, A Region of the American Institute of Architects.

G. REGIONAL OFFICE - 1966

As President of MSA, initiated a program, with appropriate funding, to employ a specialist in Lansing to provide liason between the Michigan Society of Architects and State Government, and established a permanent office for MSA in Detroit.

H. PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS - 1965

Served on a "Blue Ribbon" MSA Committee which developed a recommended fee schedule to serve as a guideline for the profession.

I. STATUTE OF LIMITATIONS - 1965-67

Co-chairman of a joint committee with the Michigan Society of Professional Engineers which drafted the first Statute of Limitations Legislation for design professionals in the state. Through continuing efforts of this committee, the legislation is now law.

J. GOVERNMENT RELATIONS - 1965

As Vice President of MSA, organized first government relations dinner party, held in the rotunda of the State Capitol as part of MSA Convention in Lansing.

K. ARCHITECTURAL SERVICES TO THE PUBLIC - 1964-65

Chaired a State Committee which developed MSA Document 65-8, Architectural Services, a simplified description for potential clients of services to expect from an Architect, methods of selection, and basis of compensation based on national publications. This document is still in use by the profession and clients in Michigan.

L. AIA/MSA CONVENTIONS - 1964

Founded a policy of rotating the State Architects Convention to major cities around Michigan. First "out state" convention held in Lansing in 1965 had record attendance by Architects.

M. REGIONAL PUBLICATIONS - 1963-65

Served on committee of MSA Board which recommended and implemented taking over architectural publications of the Society from private contractors. Established and staffed a full time MSA office in Detroit, with the first full time Executive Secretary of MSA.

N. LOCAL DESIGN CODES - 1962-63

Architectural representative on a committee appointed by the Mayor to study and update Grand Rapids Building Code. Through his leadership, the City was convinced to adopt a national code. Later, all adjoining suburban cities and townships were encouraged to do the same and also adopted this code.

O. AIA ADVANCEMENT - 1962

One of the founders of Grand Valley Chapter American Institute of Architects.
