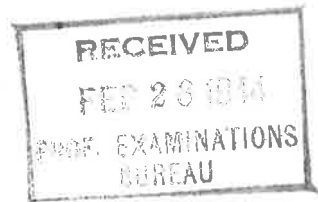

Dear Mr. Baldwin:

I have your letter of August 26th with respect to the medal to be presented to Mort Wolfe.

Item 6 of our agreement with Sidney Waugh reads as follows:

"It is understood and agreed that the models will become the property of The American Institute of Architects who will have sole and exclusive rights of reproduction in any form or manner, publication, copyrights, etc."

The American Institute of Architects has copyrighted the medal. Therefore, it will be necessary for you to write me a formal letter requesting the use of the copyrighted design and assuring me that you will do the following: Somewhere on the medal which you are going to present to Mort inscribe a small circle, which need not be more than one-eighth of an inch in diameter, and in the circle, inscribe the letter "C". Perhaps you can find some place on the medal where this will be as inconspicuous as possible, but it will be necessary in order that the Institute's copyright be not violated.

I am sorry to put you to all this trouble, especially in connection with such a nice idea. We gratefully appreciate the thought.

Mr. Wolfe was interested in golfing early in his career. He was also an avid fisherman and hunter and also did much traveling. He belonged to a few sportsmen's clubs, the last being the Elma Gun and Field Club of Buffalo, N. Y., of which he was a Past President.

Most of Mr. Wolfe's interests centered around his profession of architecture. His career started about 1903 and ended with his retirement in 1962, a period of 59 years. His landmarks of buildings are many. Most of these are still standing even though many were erected in the early 1900s. Mr. Wolfe had the reputation in Buffalo of turning out some of the finest plans in an architectural firm in the Buffalo area.

His contributions to the City of Buffalo in the rewriting and bringing up-to-date of the Building Code of that city was one of his great accomplishments. He served unstintingly on the Building Code Committee which he formed, up to the time of his retirement in 1962.

He served for many years as Chairman of the Practice of Architecture Committee of the Buffalo-Western New York Chapter, AIA, and contributed greatly to the stopping of illegal practice of architecture in the Buffalo area. He also served as a Director of the New York State Association of Architects and on various committees. His work in handling of the Commercial Exhibits at the yearly conventions of this Association was always a great success.

Mr. Wolfe was honored at a testimonial dinner by the Buffalo-Western New York Chapter, upon the occasion of his 50th year in the practice of architecture.

He was also a Licensed Engineer which was an asset to the success of his professional office.

He was a guest at many dinner and luncheon meetings of the Construction Industry Employers Association both before his retirement in 1962 and throughout the years he was retired, up to the time of his death. He represented the Buffalo-Western New York Chapter as a member of this Association for many years during his professional career as an Architect and Engineer.

A citation award for his three years of service to the Buffalo-Western New York Chapter, AIA as President in 1945-46-47 was to have been presented to him at a dinner honoring all Chapter Past Presidents in March of this year, 1966.
