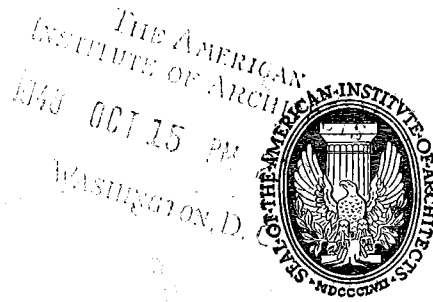

Gentlemen:

This will acknowledge and thank you for your check in the amount of \$55.00 in payment of Institute dues for 1951 for Messrs. Wright, Metcalf and Parsons.

With reference to your question concerning dues:

Dues for new members are \$5.00 per year and increase \$5.00 each year until they reach the amount paid by Institute members generally - which at the present time is \$40.00.

However, since Mr. Parsons was elected to membership on December 17, 1948, and his notice of election was not mailed until nearly the close of that year, no charge for dues was made for that year and his initial year began with 1949.

Messrs. Wright and Metcalf were elected effective November, 1948, and their first year's dues were based on 1948, with proportion of dues allocated to 1949, and this accounts for the difference in dues for the members of your firm.
