

This will acknowledge and thank you for your check in the amount of \$55.00 in payment of Institute dues for 1951 for Messrs. Wright, Metaalf and Parsons.

With reference to your question concerning dues:

Dues for new members are \$5.00 per year and increase \$5.00 each year until they reach the amount paid by Institute members generally - which at the present time is \$40.00.
