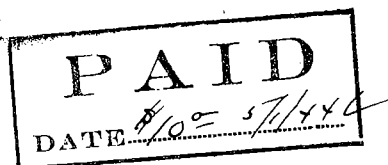

The Secretary regrets to notify you that your application for membership in The Institute and its Central New York Chapter, dated April 21, 1944, was not granted.
