The pertinent part of Section 16 of the Missouri registration law, reads as follows:

"Section 16. At any time within one year after this Act becomes effective, upon application therefor and the payment of the registration fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25), the proper division of the Board shall issue a certificate of registration, without oral or written examination, to any architect or professional engineer who shall submit under oath evidence satisfactory to the proper division that he is of good character, that he has been a resident of the State of Missouri for at least one year immediately preceding the date of his application, that he was practicing architecture or professional engineering prior to the time this Act becomes effective, and that he has had responsible charge of work of important character.* * *"

Dear Mr. Eidson:

We have received your letter dated December 31st regarding your Institute membership.

Dues are the same for all corporate members (\$50 a year, plus supplemental dues), except for newly elected members, who are able to pay dues on a graduated scale. In addition, of course, it is not possible to maintain Institute membership without being assigned to a Chapter. We are sorry we are unable to offer more encouraging advice in this connection.

Under the circumstances, upon receipt of the required approval of the Kansas City Chapter, further action may be taken on your request to resign.

There is a type of membership called Membership Emeritus, whereby a member is relieved of further dues payments. However, we do not believe that you are eligible for such status at this time. It is available to those who are so incapacitated as to be unable to engage in architecture; or those who have reached 65 years and are retired; or those who have reached 70 years, regardless of whether or not they have retired. In the event that you do qualify for Membership Emeritus or wish to remain in The Institute until you are so qualified, please let us know. Otherwise, as indicated above, upon hearing further from the Chapter your resignation may be accepted.

Dear Mr. Eidson:

The Executive Committee has studied your recent inquiry concerning possible waiver of Chapter Dues. It was the opinion of the Committee that this could not be done with the information available. The Octagon has also made it clear that every A.I.A. member must belong to a Chapter and pay dues to both the Chapter and to the National Organisation.

The Bylaws of the Kansas City Chapter allow the Executive Committee to waive the annual dues of any Corporate member in whole or in part for any year "in exceptional instances and under exceptional circumstances for what it deems adequate cause". To the best of our knowledge, this provision has only been used once and it was a case of unusually difficult circumstances. The Executive Committee is very reluctant to waive Chapter dues. If you feel that your circumstances warrant further consideration, please contact president Gene Lefebvre.

We hope that you will be able to maintain your membership in the Kansas City Chapter.

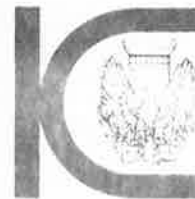

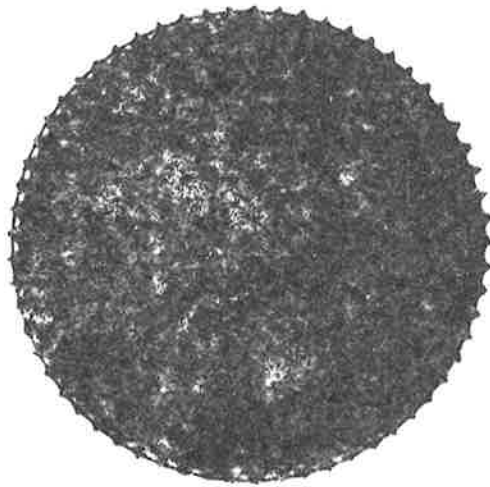

Upon retirement last month, Mr. Eidson sent a letter of resignation to the chapter; we, then, asked him to complete the form for emeritus status.
