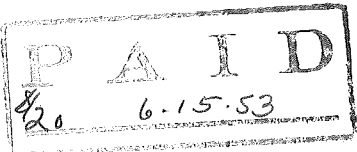

Dear John:

It is with a great deal of reluctance that I write this letter concerning my membership in the AIA. Unfortunately, the status of my business has been on a steady decline and for several months I have barely made actual office expenses.

Several years ago when the decision was made to incorporate the Clemson Architectural Foundation into membership in the AIA, several of the smaller firms vigorously protested that we were being forced out of the chapter. This has proved to be true in that I can no longer afford the status symbol of AIA. While I have paid \$50.00 on this year's dues to the state, I have been unable to pay the balance which is slated for the Clemson Architectural Foundation and, also, I have been unable to pay the national dues. From national headquarters I have received constant reminders that I will be suspended from the AIA; therefore, I find that it is necessary for me to resign and hope that sometime in the future I may be able to reactivate this membership.

Will you please extend my regrets to the members of the chapter?

It is with regret that we have received copy of your letter to the South Carolina Chapter tendering your resignation as a member of The Institute.

Unless payment is made for 1964 Institute dues, your resignation cannot be accepted as a member in good standing.


Dear Miss Marx:
