

During World War II, Volk was called upon by the Army and the Navy to set up an organization of architects and engineers known as Florida Associates. Under Volk's leadership, they designed and supervised construction of nine Army and Navy airports, two FHA housing projects in Boca Raton and Opa Locka, and a medical center and hospital to accommodate 10,000 men in Daytona Beach. They also converted the Breaker's Hotel into a hospital, as well as 40 Daytona Beach hotels for use by the Women's Army Corps. After the war, they were all reconverted back for private use.
