Dear Mr. Robinson:

I have been handling the application for Fellowship of Frederic von Grossmann of Milwaukee and I think it might be well to give you the history of the case.

When I first contemplated the application, I contacted Arthur O. Reddemann, President of the Wisconsin Architects Association, to ask if the Chapter Board would endorse the application of Mr. von Grossmann, having in mind that there are three forms of endorsement available - 1, the Chapter Board; 2, Fellows of the Chapter; 3, ten Corporate members. He informed me that he was sure the Chapter Board did not care to endorse anybody until the application of William G. Herbst had been accepted or rejected. Our Chapter Committee on Fellowships, of which I am secretary, has taken the same stand.

I then wrote to The Institute for Application 3 which is endorsement by ten corporate members. This was duly filled out, reaching the Jury of Fellows before the stated time.

However, I thought I would appear before the Chapter Board, myself, to ask for the Board's endorsement, which I did at a Board meeting on November 14. After discussing the von Grossmann application, they told me they would consider no applicant at that time other than Mr. Herbst but would discuss the matter in executive session and send me a letter of their final decision.

I received the promised letter, dated December 21, 1956, signed by A.O. Reddemann, Chapter President. Mr. Reddemann has given me his permission to send his letter to the Jury of Fellows and it is herewith attached.

I am so writing, neither in criticism of the Chapter Board nor our Committee on Fellowships, but to explain why I used the method of endorsement by ten corporate members in submitting the von Grossmann application.




