Deaths and Funerals

Mankato architect, William Wick, dies

Memorial services for Mankato architect William Thure Wick, 74, 610 South Ave., who died Thursday at Hennepin County General Hospital, will be 11 a.m. Monday at Grace Lutheran Church, the Rev. Marbury Anderson officiating.

Visitation will be 3 to 5 p.m. Sunday at Woodland Hills Funeral Home.

Mr. Wick was born April 28, 1908, in Ironwood, Mich., to John A. and Kristina (Stolpe) Wick. He



attended the University of Minnesota. On Jan. 2, 1929, he married Esther Gustafson in Ironwood, Mich. He founded Wick & Stansfield, Architects, in 1932 and was president of that and successor

firms Wick, Stansfield & Kagermeier (1965) and Wick, Kagermeier & Skaar (1973-76). He retired in 1976.

Buildings in the area designed by his firm include Mankato East High School, Mankato Area Vocational-Technical Institute, Koppen Gardens, Monroe School, the Minnesota Valley Regional Library, KEYC-TV and the Nicollet County Courthouse addition.

He was a member and past district/state president of the Exchange Club and a member of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks and the Loyal Order of Moose. Professional affiliations include the American Institute of Architects; the Minnesota Society of Architects, of which he was past director; the Mankato Builders' Exchange, and the Construction Specifications Institute.

Mr. Wick is survived by his wife, Esther; two sons, John W. of Evanston, Ill., and C. Michael of Beaumont, Texas; four daughters, Betty (Mrs. Jack) Kiefer of Juneau, Alaska, Evelyn (Mrs. Jack) Wilson of Mesa, Ariz., Marilyn (Mrs. Marvin) Dundas of Mankato, and Linda (Mrs. Bill) Klein of White Bear Lake; two sisters, Gerda Angelesdes of Arlington, Wash., and Elsie Wergedal of Boyd, Wis.; 20 grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren. Seven brothers preceded him in death.
