TO RECEIVE KEMPER AWARD

Hold For Release February 15, 1975:

WASHINGTON, D.C., Feb. 15, 1975--The American Institute of Architects announced today that F. Carter Williams, FAIA, of Raleigh, N.C. has been selected to receive the Institute's Edward C. Kemper Award for 1975.

Named in honor of the late executive director of the Institute, the Kemper Award is given each year for significant contribution to the Institute and to the profession of architecture.

The award will be presented at the annual convention of The American Institute of Architects, to be held in Atlanta, Ga., May 18-22, 1975.

Williams' longstanding concern with professional ethics and judiciary matters led to his being named the first chairman of the newly organized AIA National Inquiry Committee in 1974. This committee can investigate charges of professional misconduct, hold hearings, and when warranted, act as plaintiff before professional judiciary boards.

Williams' involvement with judiciary matters includes a term as chairman of the Judiciary Committee of the N.C. Chapter AIA, a term as chairman of the

Regional Judiciary Committee for the South Atlantic Region, membership and a term as chairman on the AIA National Judiciary Board, and membership in an AIA task force studying and revising the Institute's Standards of Professional Practice.

Over the past 28 years, Williams has held virtually every elective office in the North Carolina Chapter AIA. He has also played an important role in a variety of professional affairs in North Carolina. As a member of the N.C. Chapter's Contracts and Fees Committee, he was instrumental in setting up the first graduated fee schedule adopted in the state, making it possible for younger architects to take on smaller commissions at reasonable fees. While serving as co-chairman of the chapter's Legal Affairs Committee, he worked successfully for amendments and improvements to the state's Architectural Practice Act. As a member of the N.C. Board of Architecture he composed and administered a variety of professional registration examinations.

A graduate of North Carolina State College and the University of Illinois, Williams has been a principal in F. Carter Williams, Architects, since 1946.
