Dear Mr. Wilson:

As you are doubtless aware, the Executive Secretary, Mr. E. C. Kemper, has referred your note attached to your bill to this office.

The American Institute of Architects has, through the efforts of its Officers and Directors, committees and representatives, successfully presented the case of the architects to the Government. The members of the profession are rendering service on virtually all of the war construction program that falls within the proper jurisdiction of the architect.

However, unfortunately the construction program cannot absorb all of the architectural talent that is available in the country. The reason for this is obvious. Although the dollar volume of the war construction program is tremendous nevertheless the number of projects forming the program is relatively small. These projects are individually of unusual size and scope.

On no occasion does The American Institute of Architects seek to obtain employment or commissions for individual members of The Institute or of the profession. The Institute would give every assistance to the individual members, however, to aid them to obtain work for themselves.
