It allows a positive and helpful response to requests for factual information on architects, and in that way constitutes a service to the profession.

The firm has facilities for 25 Architectural draftsmen in addition to the principals, secretarial and accounting personnel and operators for ozalid and multilith equipment. 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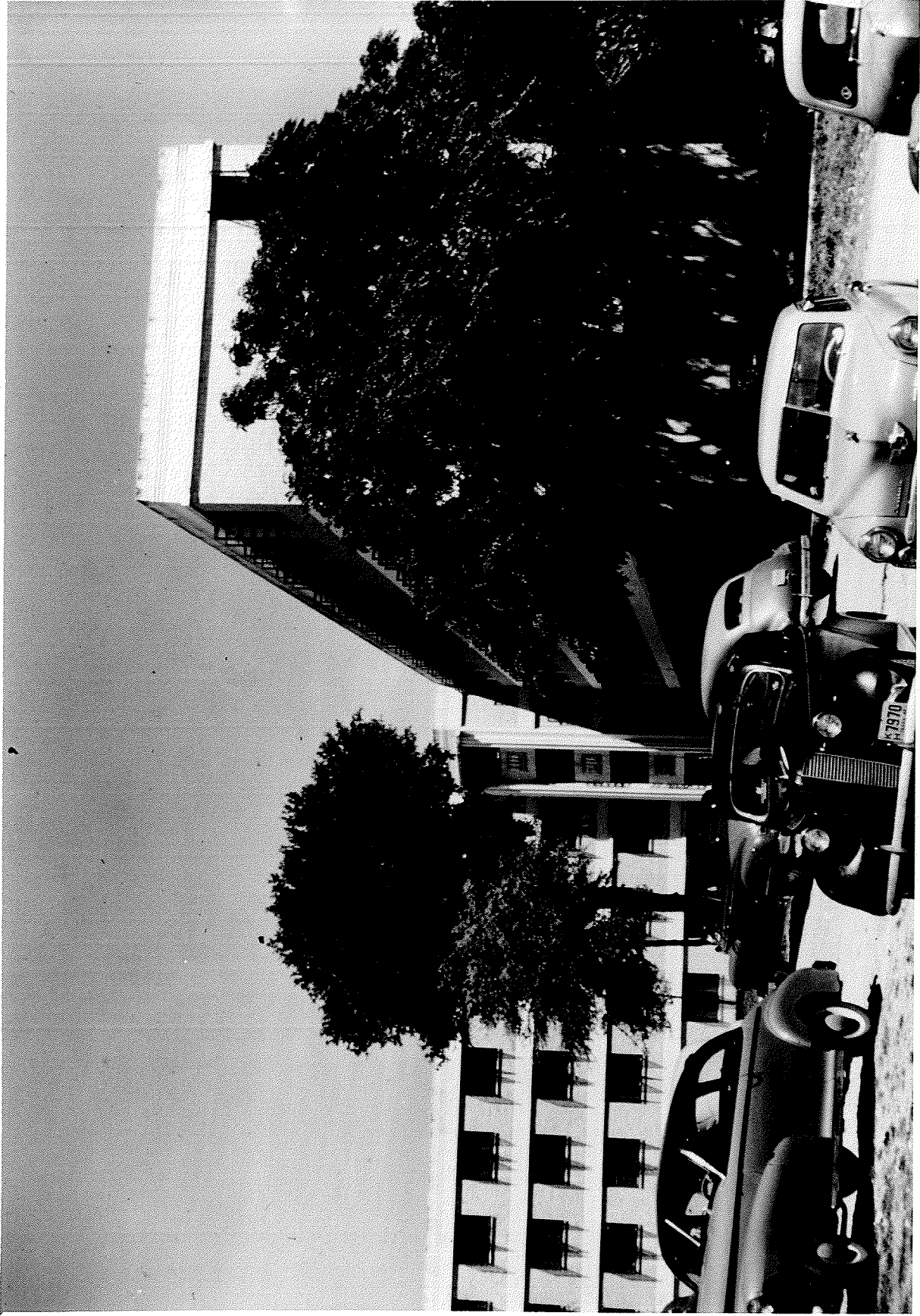
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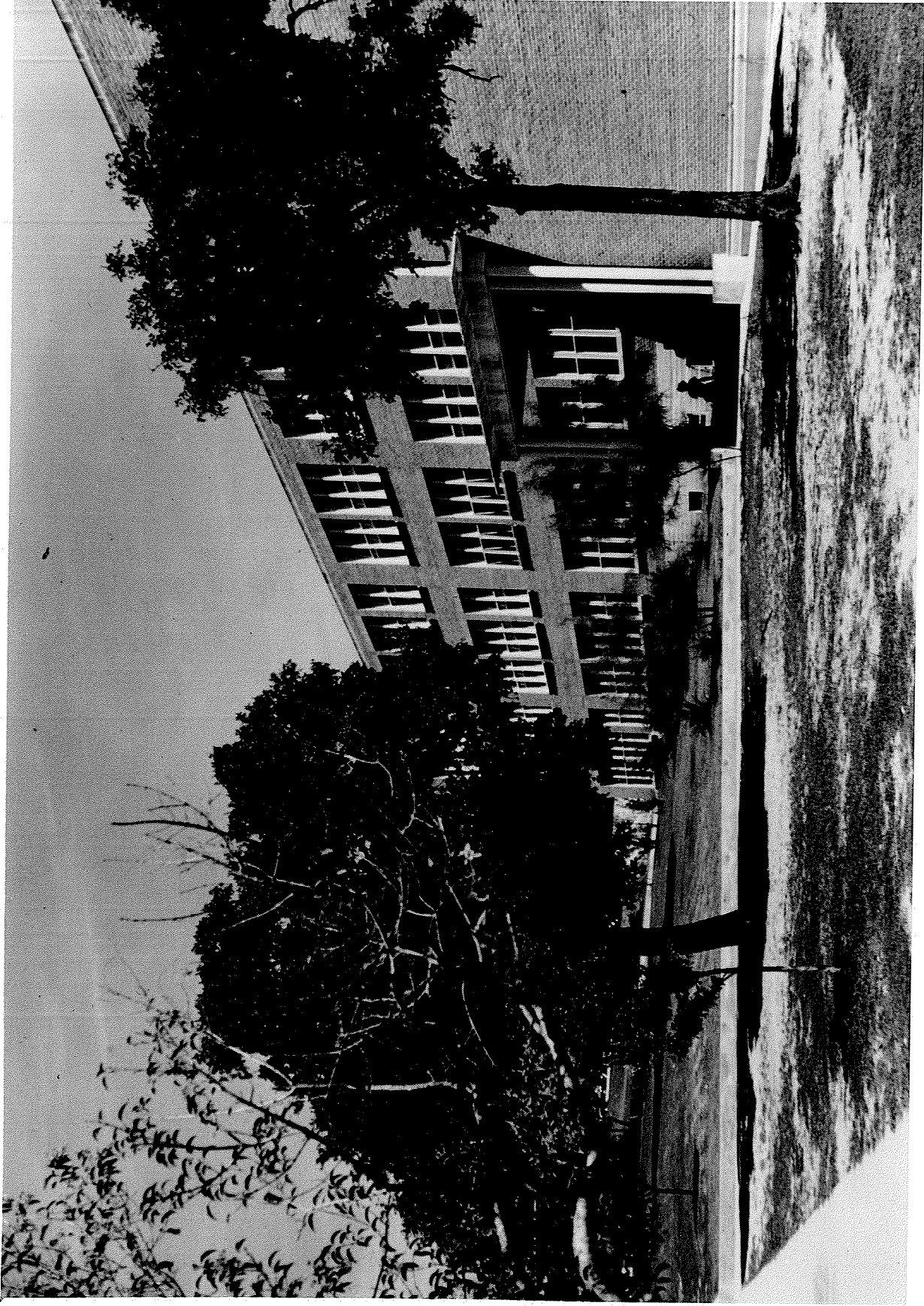
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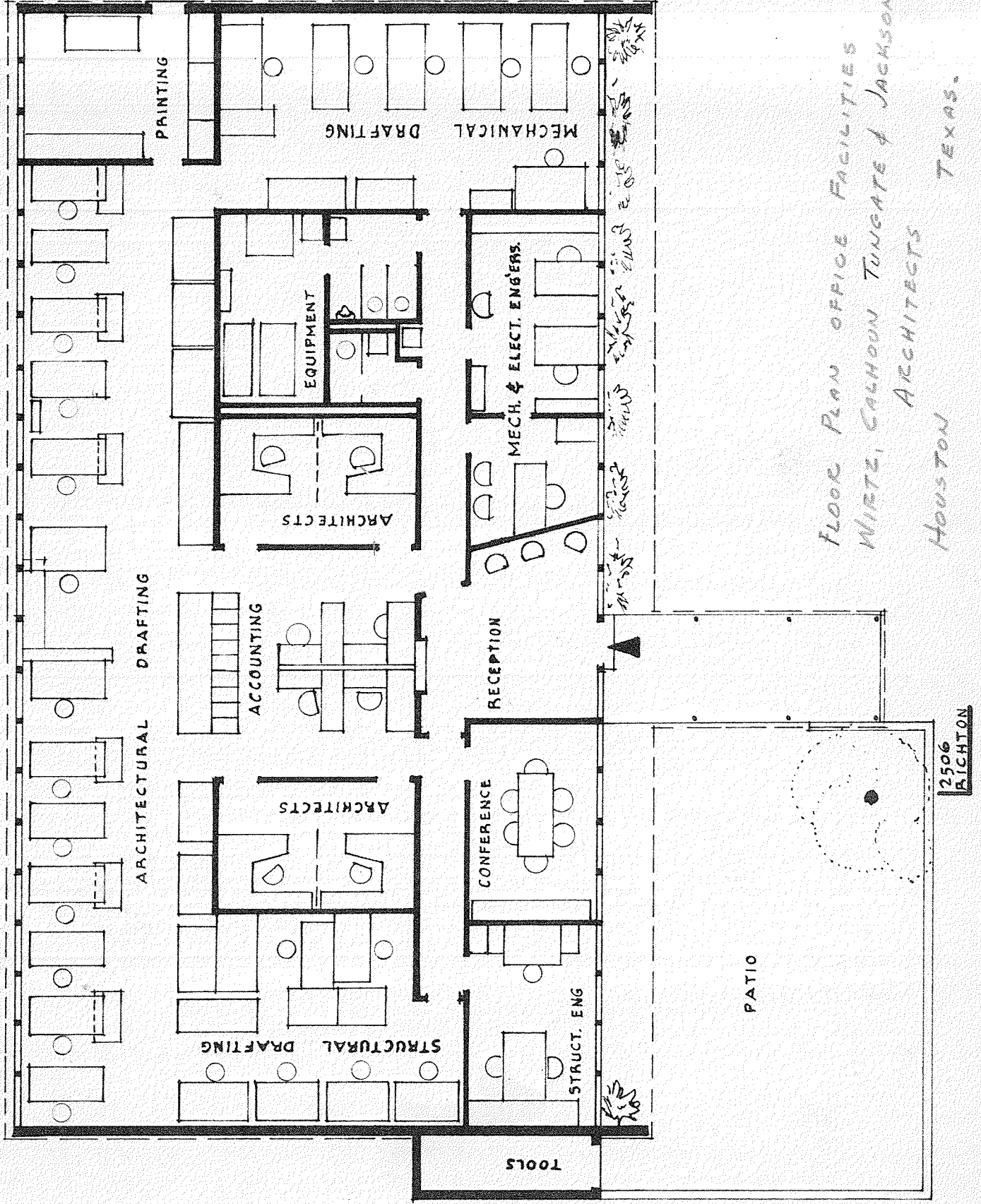
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FLOOR PLAN OFFICE FACILITIES
