Under separate cover I am forwarding to you two sets of plans together with the two sets of photographs of the executed buildings.

I sincerely trust I have selected appropriate projects, but in a case of this nature, it seems difficult to decide.

One of the projects I selected is the La Jolla Beach & Yacht Club and the plans and details forwarded to you consist of a block plan of the entire scheme, and a structure known as the Esplanade Building. This building is now being used as the Club headquarters during the building operations of the lagoon, harbor, main building, and cottages. The entire project will run to over a million and a quarter, and the scheme is one over which I am very enthusiastic.

The other project provided an interesting architectural study in orientation and community grouping, inasmuch as it meant transferring the Theosophical Society from their cramped quarters in Hollywood to a one hundred and twenty-five acre site in the middle of the Ojai Valley, California. The group shown forms the neucleus of a theosophical community center.

As a personal favor would you be kind enough to reply to this letter stating whther, in your opinion, I have provided sufficient material for your purpose, or whether you would recommend my sending you other types of structures. For instance I have produced a few feature hotel structures, such as the Aztec Hotel, Monrovia, California, the first structure using the principles of ancient Mayan architecture, and "The Indian Village" Soboba Hot Springs, California, a group of buildings designed to perpetuate the historical side



Funeral services for architect-explorer Robert Stacy-Judd, 90, noted for the use of a Mayan motif in many of his building designs, will be conducted at 1030 a.m. Friday in the Wee Kirk o' the Heather, Forest Lawn Memorial-Park, Glendale.

He died Monday in Parkwood Community Hospital, Canoga Park.

Stacy-Judd incorporated the Mayan motif, which he studied during two Yucatan expeditions, into such buildings as the Aztec Hotel in Monrovia, the First Baptist Church in Ventura and the Philosophical Research Center on Los Feliz Blvd.

He also designed the La Jolla Beach and Yacht Chib, the North Hollywood Hospital and dozens of Tudorand Spanish-style homes in the Los Angeles area. He helped with the plans for Howard Hughes' giant "Spruce Gosse" seaplane during World War IL

Stacy-Judd was the author of "Atlantis, Mother of Empires," a book in which he linked the fabled lost continent with the Mayan people, and "Kabah," a book about his Yucatan expeditions.

Born in London, he studied architecture there and then served an apprenticeship of five years as an architect for the Great Northern Railroad in Britain before coming to the United States in 1913.

His only survivor is a niece, Mrs. Doris Bellingham of England.
