You hereby are notified of the filing of charges of alleged unprofessional conduct against Messrs. Wyatt C. Hedrick, A.I.A., Thomas E. Stanley, A.I.A., and Arthur W. Morey, A.I.A., by Messrs. Harold E. Prinz, A.I.A., and LaVere Brooks, A.I.A., for alleged violation of Rule No. 2 of the Mandatory Standards, Part II of the Standards of Professional Practice of The American Institute of Architects in connection with a proposed new office building for the Southwest Title and Insurance Company of Dallas, Texas.
