Dear Mr. Kemper,

Much to my regret I fear that I am about to lose my membership in the American Institute of Architects due to my inability to pay my dues for 1937 and 1936.

At this time last year I paid up, as I thought, a note for one years dues, but the payment was applied to the former years dues, and the note was extended for the current year. It is now my misfortune to have this note still due, and I will liquidate it at the earliest opportunity. I will also endeavor to pay up my delinquent dues as soon as possible in order that I may be reinstated in the Institute, of which I was so proud to have been a member.

Some of my financial difficulty is due to the fact that my firm has recently completed plans for a hospital building for the State of Pennsylvania, but through the involved official procedure, a substantial payment now owing has been delayed.
