



Dear Mr. Starr:

I apologize for this long delay in responding to your letter of January 13th. This is the busiest time of the year in my office and it is impossible to answer my mail as promptly as I should like to do.

The Institute does have a class of retired members, known as Members Emeriti. However, to be eligible for election as a Member Emeritus the member must have had fifteen years of prior A.I.A. membership in good standing in addition to other requirements, such as total disability or having reached the age of 65 and retired from the practice of architecture, or having reached the age of 70.

We find that you have been a member only since 1953 and, therefore, would not be eligible to apply.

It is hoped that you will find it possible to continue with your membership, but if not, and you find it necessary to resign, please let me know and we shall take the necessary steps to accept the resignation.
