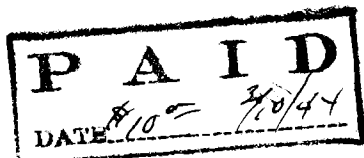

General Background: (Personal Characteristics and Accomplishments; Interests, Digressions, Travels, Friendships, Sidelights, Honors, and Awards.)

My social activities are largely directed by a friend of mine with definite ideas, my wife. My principal interest outside of my family and my church is my profession, which interests me particularly in the field of religious structures and archeological research. However, I do not believe my interest in the archeological interferes with my appreciation of the contemporary.

My travels abroad have been limited to one trip in 1932 to France and Italy. My perspective was thereby improved but I could hardly say that this trip had any direct influence upon my architectural thinking or practice.

For diversion in literary fields, I prefer research in architecture and sometimes history. For relaxation I prefer tennis, which I am sure I must soon forego in favor of something less strenuous. But sailing I enjoy also.

My intimate friendships have seldom been in the profession and I have no sidelights, honors, or awards worth mentioning. My characteristics others will know better than I and my accomplishments, if any, will have to stand the test of years to be worth mentioning. Sometimes I am surprised that I have been able to do so much while raising and educating three children in this era.

The first job I ever worked on was the Hartford County Courthouse. Cret had won the competition and I had to make the details of the main stair. Commencing as I did after a June graduation the cry soon was sounded, "Up the stairs by Christmas". The cost of the building was \$1.75 per cubic ft. I was astounded at the time.

The work with Faulkner & Kingsbury largely in Washington, is highlighted, I believe, by the George Washington University Auditorium, which though today is incomplete without its polychrome and sculptured panels over the entrances, marks the farthest this firm has advanced at the time of writing.
