





# DIGEST OF THE CAREER AND ACHIEVEMENTS OF ROBERT W. STEVENS, A.I.A.

Since its inception in 1949, much of the design success of Robert Stevens Associates has been due to imaginative and innovative use of materials. For example, in 1967, Mr. Stevens, working with U.S. Steel Corporation, pioneered the use of self-weathering (Corten) rolled sheet steel siding and roofing. Its application to the Fresno Community and Convention Center was the first such use of this material world wide, architectural applications of Corten Steel having been previously limited to rolled structural shapes. Although he has conducted his entire practice within the confines of a typically conservative rural agricultural environment, Mr. Stevens has managed to establish consistently high standards of contemporary architectural design within the community. These standards have long served as a challenge to many competing local architectural firms, and thus have had a significant influence on raising and maintaining the general architectural quality within and surrounding the community. Robert Stevens Associates has been honored with a total of 14 design awards from the San Joaquin Chapter of the American Institute of Architects, nearly 40% of the total awards given by the Chapter since the inception of the Awards Program in 1962. In addition, a second office, Stevens-Calender in Santa Cruz, California has received four Santa Cruz Civic Awards for best building design.

In the field of architectural practice, Mr. Stevens has shown his exceptional capability for administration by his extensive personal involvement in two separate architectural practices. The first office, established in Fresno, California in 1949, was followed by a second firm, Stevens-Calender, formed in Santa Cruz, California in 1964. Work loads occasionally require Mr. Stevens to divide his time between offices for extended periods of time to meet with clients, program projects, work up design concepts, make rezoning presentations and generally conduct the business of architecture. Despite this busy schedule, Mr. Stevens still has time to establish and maintain valuable client contacts. At no time in his years of practice has Mr. Stevens allowed his high standards of architectural practice to diminish. One of the best testimonials for the consistently high quality architectural services rendered by his firms over the years is the large number of repeat clients the firms have retained, including one financial institution for whom they have performed services for approximately 30 projects since 1956.
