Due to pressure of work this is the first opportunity to write to you with regard to the application received with your letter of January 13th - from Mr. Vas Selisbury Stimson for readmission to membership in The Institute and the Weshington State Chapter.

Mr. Stimson's membership terminated on March 1, 1926, for non-payment of Institute dues. He owed dues for 1924 and 1925 in the total amount of \$45.00.

Under the by-laws a former member may not be reinstated while he is indebtednto The Institute or any of its chapters. When such former members apply for readmission, they must pay for back dues unless such dues are remitted by action of The Board.

In unusual circumstances, and upon recommendation of the chapter The Board often is agreeable to the remission of back dues, provided the chapter remits any dues for the chapter for a like period; and provided the former member applies for residuation.

Also, former members are not entitled to the reduced dues now in effect for new members, and their applications for readmission must be accompanied by payment of \$25.00 - \$5.00 for the admission fee and \$20.00 for the current year's dues - in advance.

We are not writing to Mr. Stimson in this matter, as yet, as it appeared to be the better procedure to advise the chapter of the situation first and then hold the application pending advice of further instructions or recommendations from the chapter.

Should The Board act favorably, the application of Mr. Stimeon will be ready for submission to The Board of Exeminers at its next following meeting - in June.


