Dear Mr. Jensen:-

Relative to the reinstatement of Mr. David L. Stine, it would appear as Mr. Kemper has already written you, that he was dropped for non-payment of dues at January 1906 meeting of the Board of Directors.

I have been corresponding with Mr. Mauran about the question of reinstatement for I find no specific authority in the By-Laws permitting the Board of Directors to act, although I dare say under general powers the Board might have power to revoke an order which had previously been given. It seems to me however after such a lapse as has occurred in the case of Mr. Stine, that the simplest way would be for him to apply for membership, in the usual way, just as if it was a new application. He can get an application from the Secretary of the Toledo Chapter and have it counter-signed in the necessary way and forwarded to The Octagon.

If you will write to Mr. Bellman this could be done in time to be considered, in a preliminary way, at the Executive meeting in May. I am inclined to believe that this application would have to go through the ordinary routine of a new membership. In any case the first step would be the making out of an application. It would rest with the Board surely to determine the possible remission of the initiation fee and of back dues, which they would doubtless act upon in a generous manner.

I presume that you will write Mr. Bellman so that the application may be properly made out and forwarded.

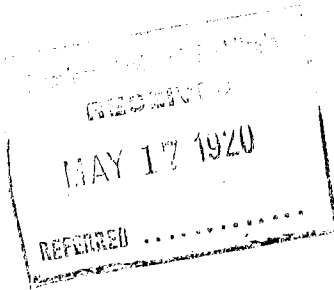

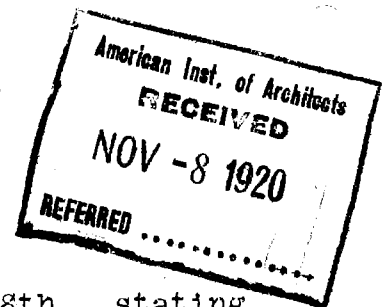

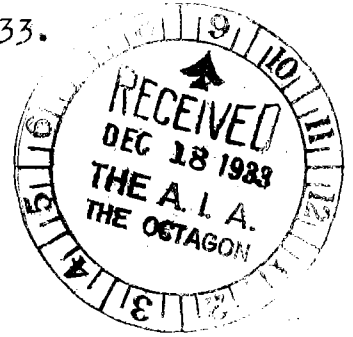

Dear Sir:

I am informed by the Secretary of the Toledo Chapter, A. I. A. that a communication has been received regarding the delinquency of the 1940 dues for Mr. David L. Stine, a Fellow of the Institute and a member in good standing of the Toledo Chapter.

As I have the honor of also being a Fellow of the Institute, I have been asked to communicate with you to ascertain if anything can be done about the remission of Mr. Stine's dues in the Institute. I am not familiar with the methods obtaining in a situation such as confronts the Stine family in Toledo, and am presuming on your time to outline this situation.

I was associated with Mr. Stine for a period of more than five years ending the year of 1892 and of course, I have known him intimately every since. It is needless for me to add my testimony to his character and upright conduct of the Architectural profession through this long period of years.

Mrs. Stine passed away about a year ago and the care of the father has devolved on the son. Mr. Stine has been bedridden since last July, is nearly blind and under the constant care of day and night nurses, and I know that the expenses and strain on the son are terrific.

No one knows how much longer Mr. Stine will be with us, but it occurred to me and to other of the older members of the Toledo Chapter that there might be some consideration given the matter of remission of dues without the necessity of striking Mr. Stine's name from the membership of the A. I. A. after a period of more than fifty years of upright business dealing.

In reply to your letter of February 12:

As you were informed by the Secretary of the Toledo Chapter, Mr. David L. Stine's membership in The Institute and that chapter was suspended on December 31, 1940, at which time he owed Institute dues for 1940 in the amount of \$20.00

Otherwise Mr. Stine's standing in The Institute is in such order as to entitle him to apply for retirement and election as a Member Emeritus. This would relieve him from the payment of further dues to The Institute and the chapter permitting him to retain all the rights and privileges of membership.

Enclosed you will find, in duplicate, A.I.A. Form S40 Application for Retirement. If you would have this application executed in behalf of Mr. Stine, and return it to The Octagon, his request will be submitted to The Board.


