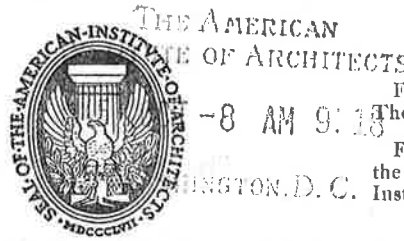

Memorandum:

At its meeting on January 8th, The Board of Examiners considered the attached application for membership and noted that Mr. Stanton is located in Oregon where he will practice as an architect. The attention of the Board was called to the ruling of The Board of Directors that registration in any state is sufficient for eligibility for membership; however, as Mr. Stanton evidently will practise as a principal, The Board of Examiners felt he should not be elected until he has been registered as an architect in Oregon.

The 1961 AIA Convention in Philadelphia has adopted the following by-law:

"Annual supplemental dues in addition to the regular annual dues shall be paid on behalf of each proprietorship, partnership, and corporation engaged in the practice of architecture, one or more of whose proprietors, partners, officers, or board members are corporate members of the Institute.

"The amount of said dues shall be calculated as a percentage of the amount paid by the firm under the Federal Insurance Contribution Act (FICA) during the preceding calendar year on behalf of their employees."
