Dear Mr. Stearns:

We are pleased to learn from your letter of September 19 that you contemplate renewing your affiliation with The Institute next year, and we outline below the procedure to be followed for reinstatement of your membership.

A letter should be addressed to The Secretary of The Institute requesting reinstatement and stating that you are professionally engaged in the practice of architecture.

Such letter should be accompanied by a remittance to cover the amount of your indebtedness to The Institute at the time you terminated your membership, plus the initiation fee and dues in advance for the first year following re-slection.

The record here shows that your membership was terminated in December, 1940, at which time you were indebted to The Institute in the sum of \$40.00, covering dues for 1939 and 1940.

Therefore, the amount of the remittance required with your letter requesting reinstatement would be \$65.00, if the admission fee and dues for 1942 remain the same as in 1941 - \$5.00 and \$20.00, respectively.

Also, The Institute by-laws require that any indebtedness which the applicant for re-election may owe to the chapter to which he was assigned be paid up before any consideration is given the application.

Upon receipt of your letter and remittance The Secretary's office will follow through the required procedure.
