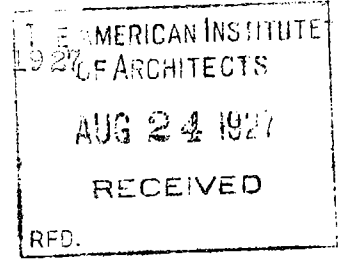

Dear Mr. Kemper:

Dear Miss Riedel:

Responding to your letter of August 22nd, we have had no further communication from Mr. Sterner and he is now indebted to the Institute for dues for \$50.00 on account of 1926 and 1927.

However, he claims that he resigned in 1925. We have no record of such resignation at The Octagon.

The matter can be disposed of by the Executive Committee of the Institute at the coming meeting in September if you will send a letter stating that Mr. Sterner's resignation is approved by the New York Chapter.

If the Chapter does not approve the resignation and wishes to drop Mr. Sterner for non-payment of Chapter dues, the recommendation should be to that effect. So far as Institute dues are concerned, it is probable that the Executive Committee would accept Mr. Sterner's word about his attempted resignation and would permit him to resign in good standing as of December 31, 1925. Of course, it would not do this unless the Chapter approved, as indicated above.

If you will advise as to the wishes of the Chapter in time for the Executive meeting the case can be disposed of finally.
