It allows a positive and helpful response to requests for factual information on architects, and in that way constitutes a service to the profession.

The American Institute of Architects assumes no responsibility for the accuracy of statements made in this Questionnaire. The obligation to maintain this record as a current description of an architectural firm rests with the firm, and supplementary record forms are available for this purpose.

1941 - The Federal Works Agency, at request of U.S. Public Health Office selected me to do three hospital additions and to be their consultant on a fourth hospital during the war period. Also employed by engineering firm of Leeds, Hill, Barnard and Jewitt as hospital consultant on three army hosps.


Dear Mr. Stanton:

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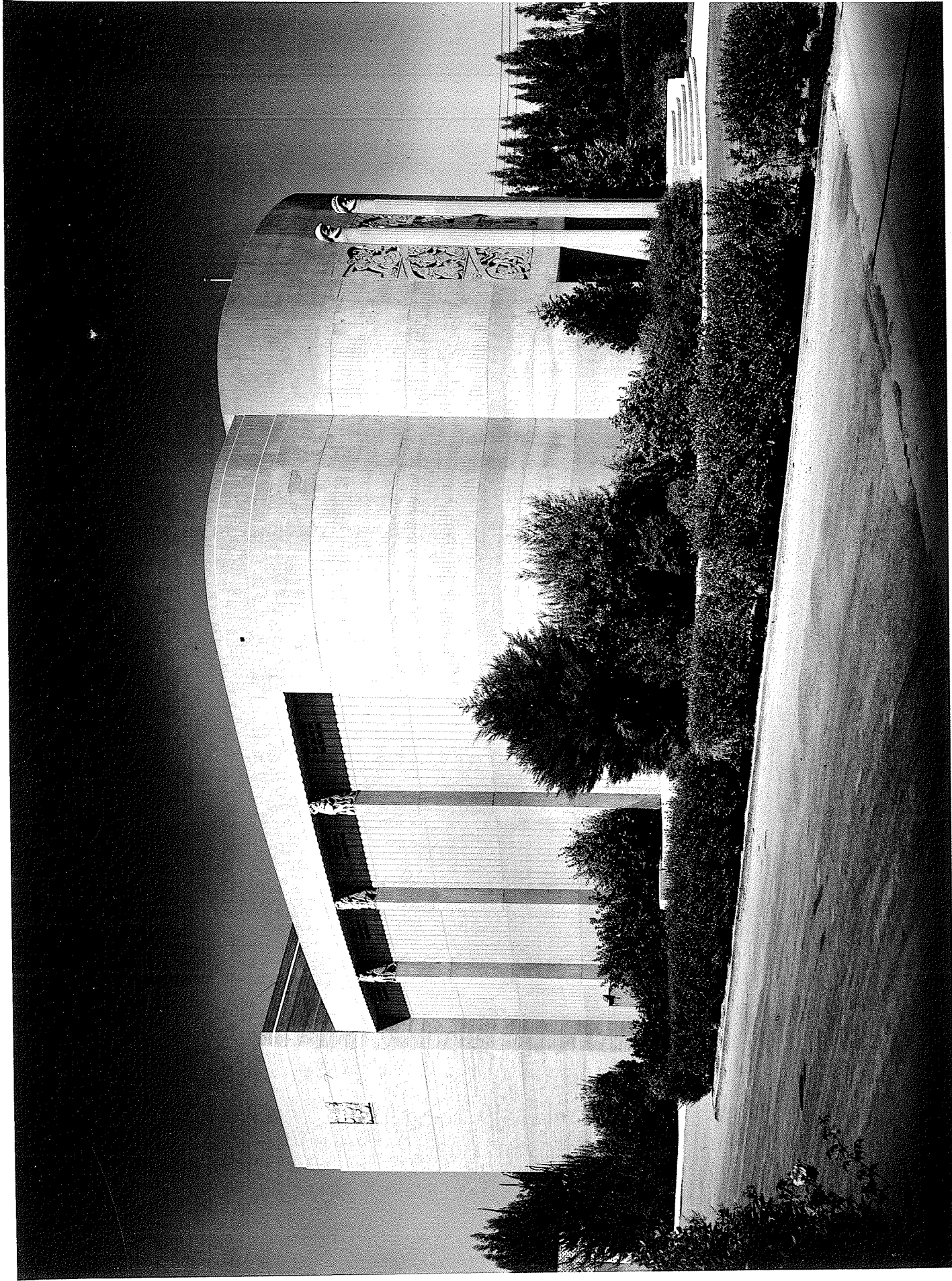

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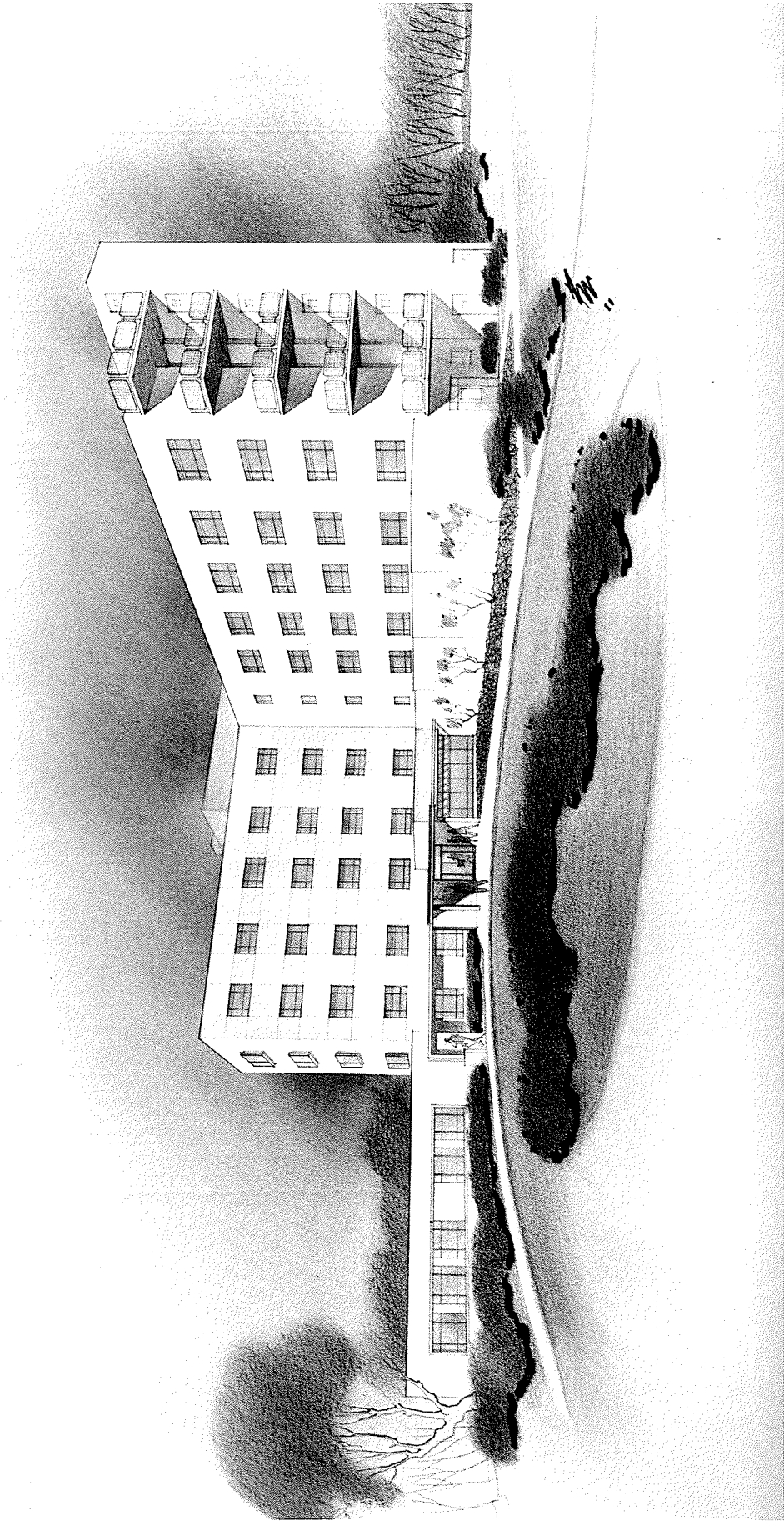

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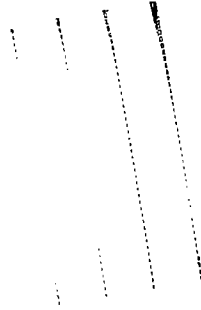
