Reference may be made to The Architects' Roster in negotiations with government agencies and other interested parties. Experience with the Roster since its establishment in 1946 has shown its usefulness. Growing out of an earlier Register of architects qualified for public works, The Roster provides at The Octagon an accurate, current record of the qualifications and achievements of members of the profession. It allows a positive and helpful response to requests for factual information on architects, and in that way constitutes a service to the profession.

The American Institute of Architects assumes no responsibility for the accuracy of statements made in this Questionnaire. The obligation to maintain this record as a current description of an architectural firm rests with the firm, and supplementary record forms are available for this purpose.

Administrative Architect: Client contact-Finances-General supervision of other key personnel-Specific supervision of chief designer, and chief draftsman-General construction supervision-Specification writing.

Executive Architect: Client contact-General supervision of other key personnel-Specific supervision of Superintendent and Office Manager. Issuance of certificates-Engineering direction-General construction supervision-Specification writing-Acquiring of men.

Chief Designer: Client contact on details of design-Responsible for all art work, color selections, renderings, sample approval, sketches-Assist in execution of full size details, working drawings, etc., Supervision with chief draftsman of other draftsmen.

Chief Draftsman: Execution in the form of working drawings of all preliminaries etc., Responsible for all drawings released for execution by trades-Checking of shop drawings-Order and neatness in drafting room-Charge of samples-Supervises draftsmen along with chief designer-Filing of all reproductions, shop drawings, tracings, and sketches-Make job progress charts.

Field Superintendent: Construction reports to Administrative and Executive Architects-Expediting of work in the field Superintendence of construction-Field contact with client problems and changes-Checking shop drawings with chief draftsman-Checking monthly contractor requisitions for payment.

Office Manager: Correspondence filing (other than drawings and samples) typing, general secretarial, general bookkeeping (with auditor)-Payrolls-Building cleaning, general maintenance and care-Tax payments-Telephone-Mailing-Blueprinting-Personnel records-Reproduction-Ditto.

Accountant: Keeping of tax records, mailing out tax forms, preparation of financial statements, preparation of balance sheets, supervision of bank records.
