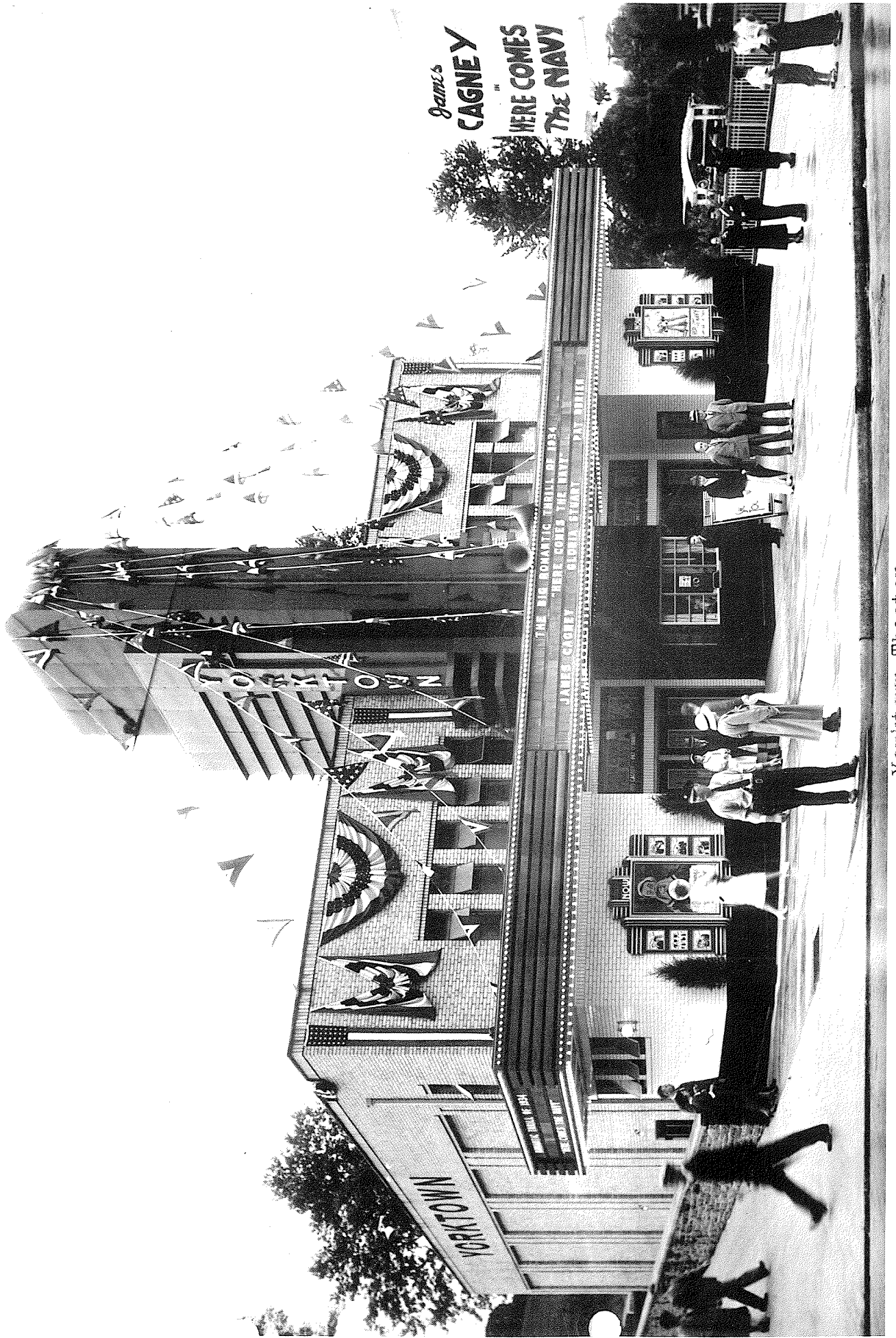

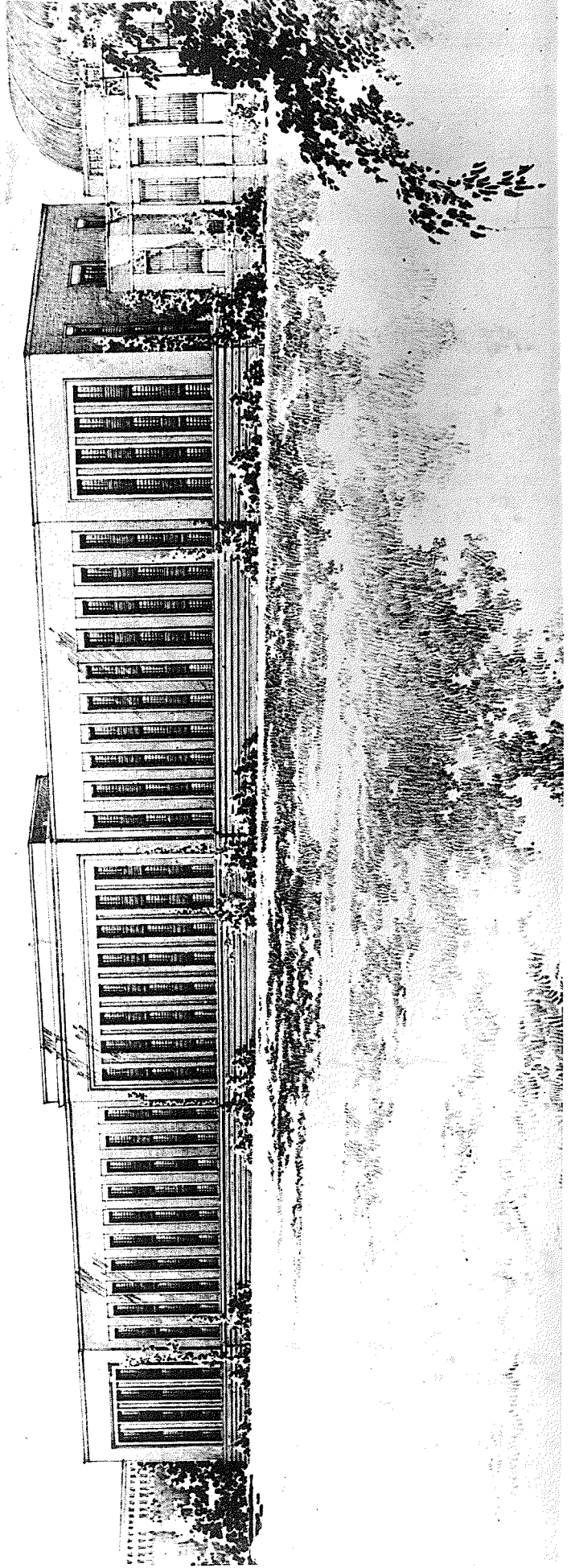

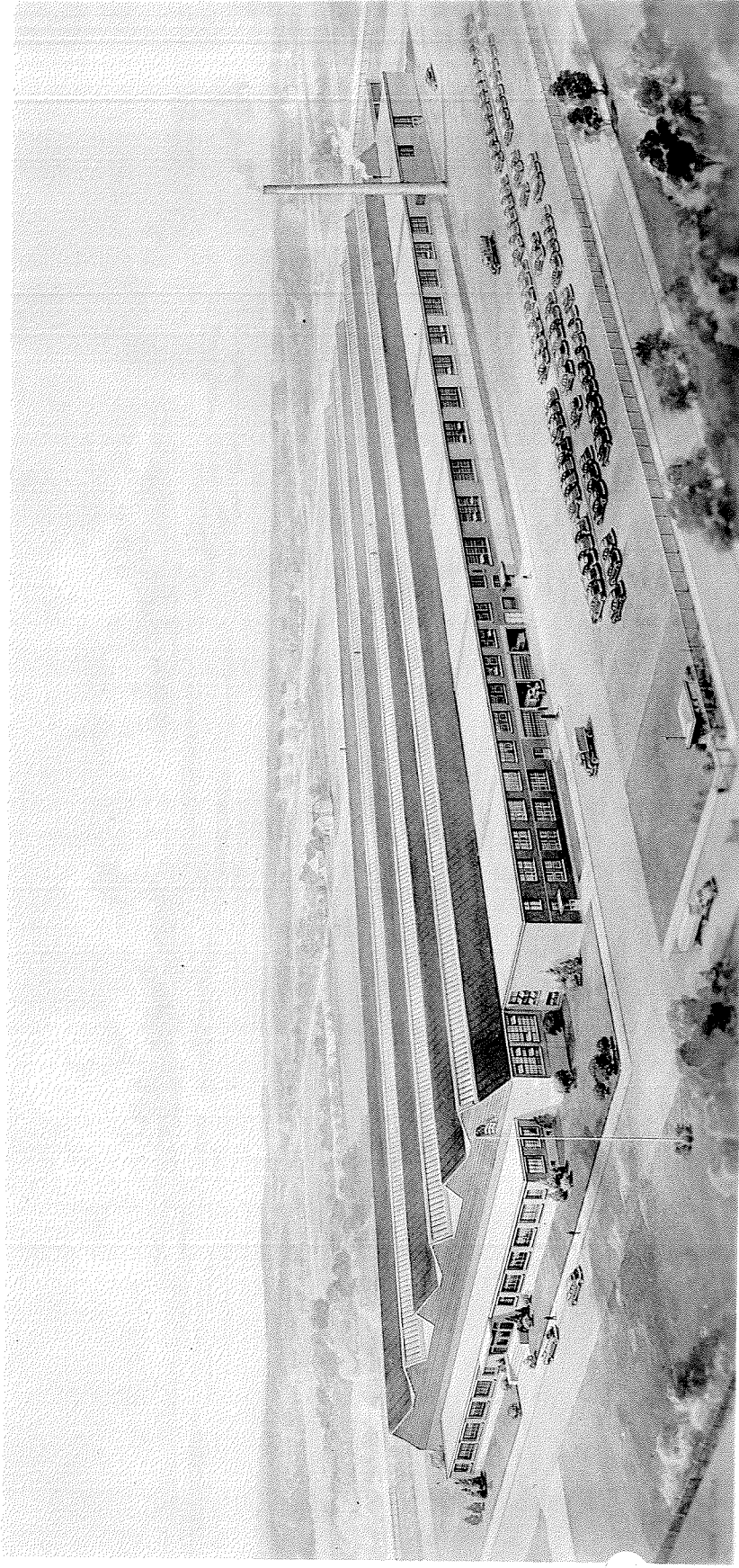

Aircraft Piston Ring Factory at Scranton, Penn'a.

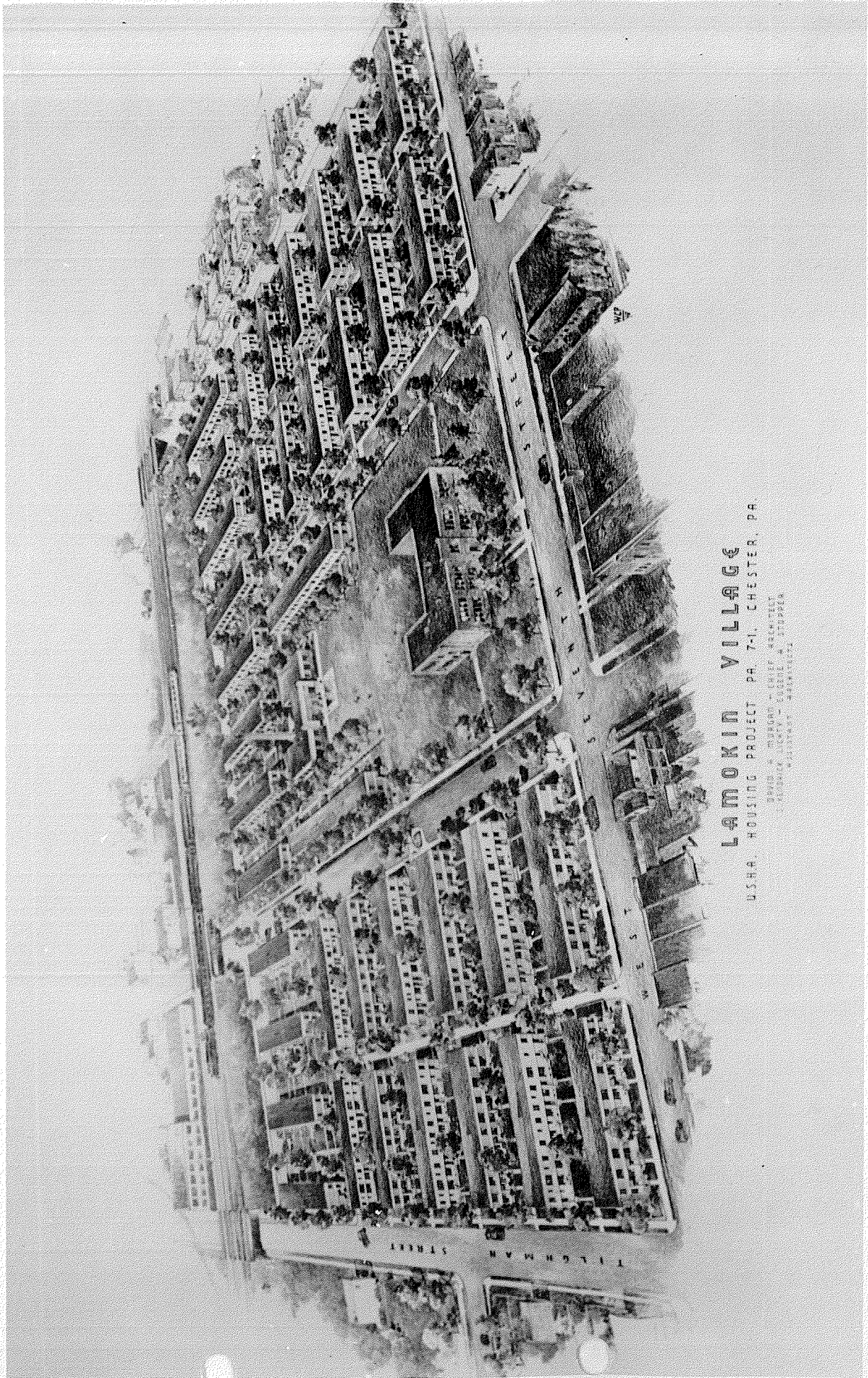

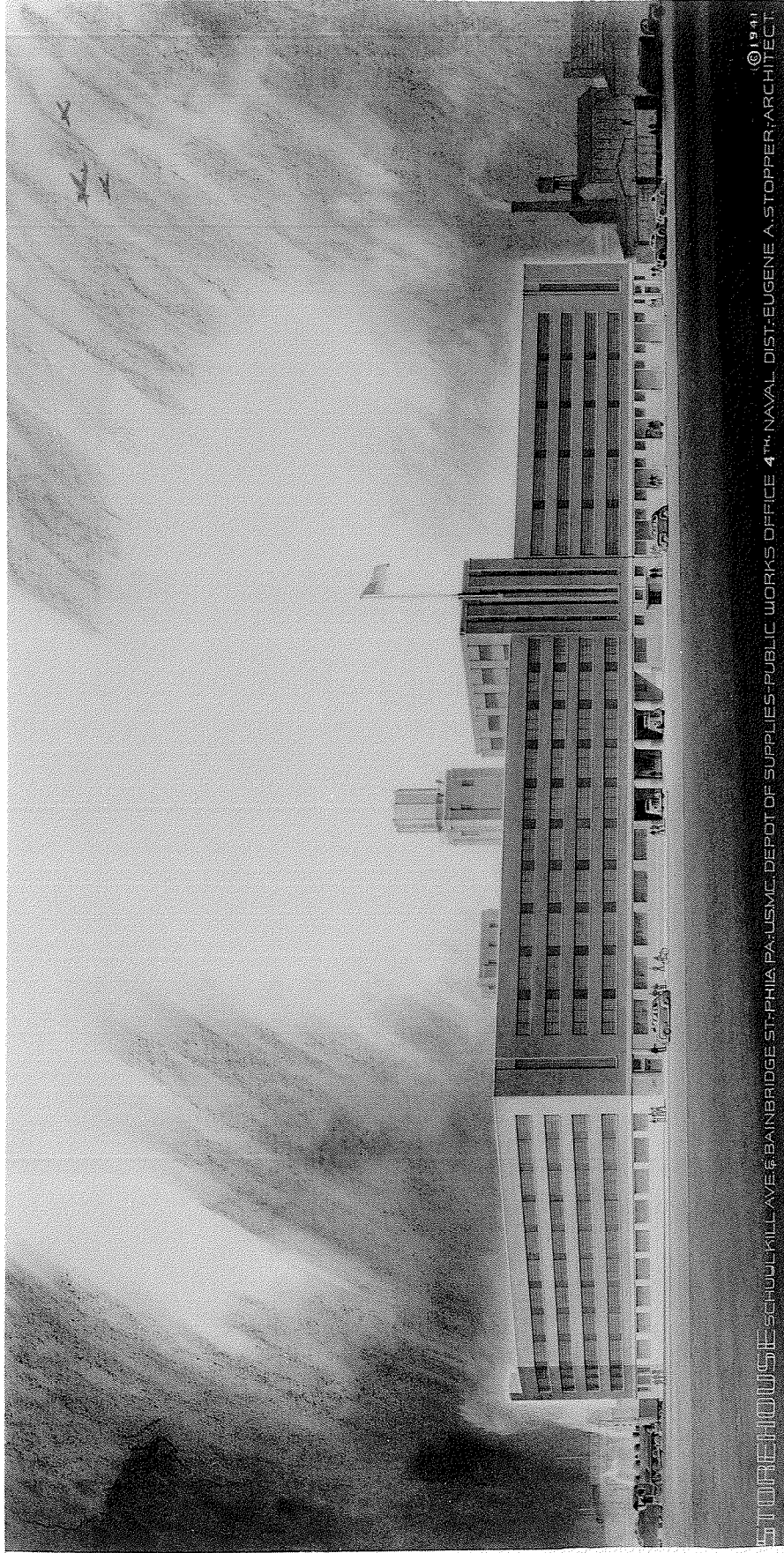

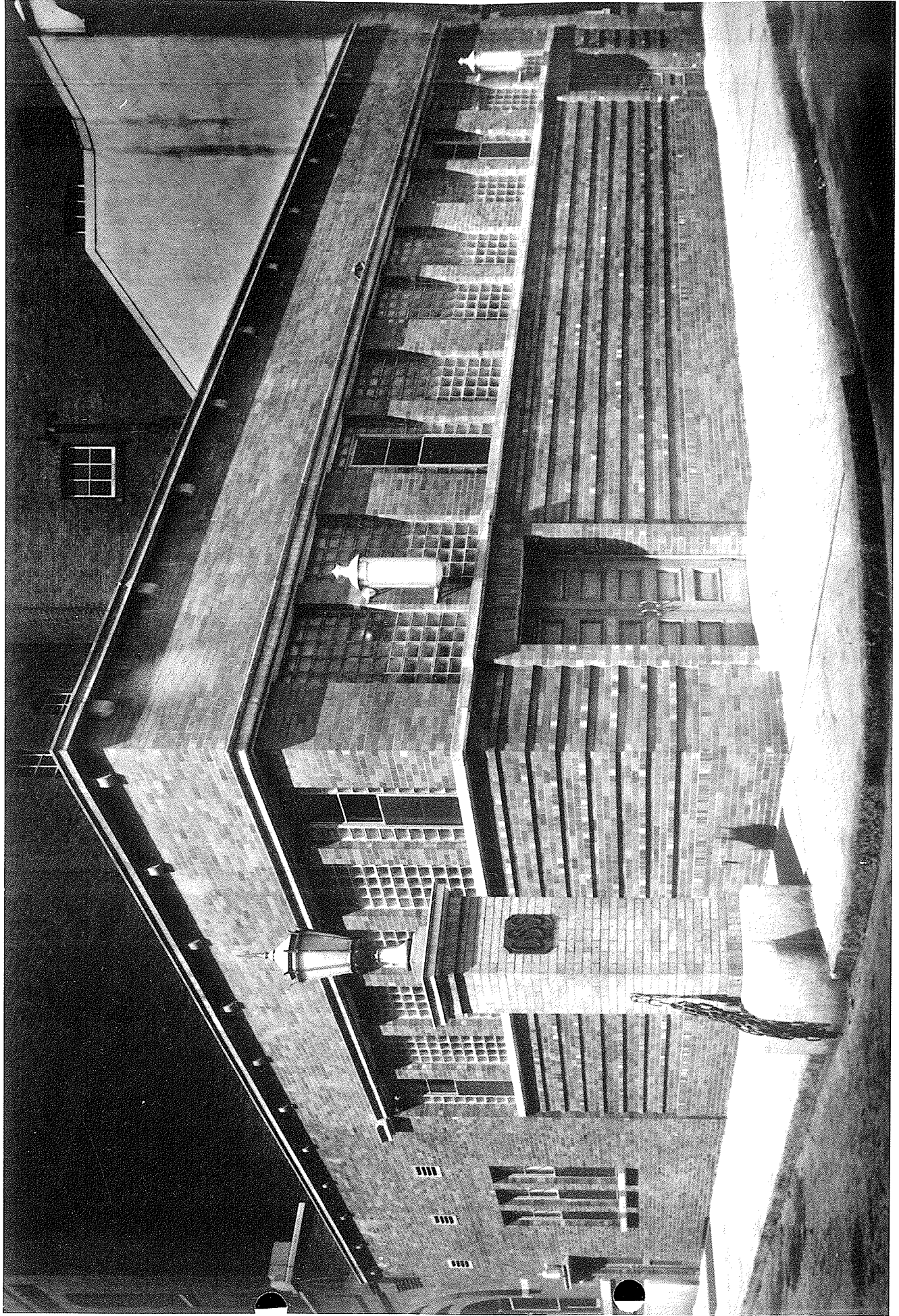
