Mr. Wagoner was architect for the new National Presbyterian Church, Washington, D. C. He has won 12 special awards for church designs in all parts of the country - including Grace Lutheran Church, State College, and First Presbyterian Church, Avenel, N.J.

He has been instructor in architecture at Drexel Institute of Technology for 23 years. He is a former president of the Philadelphia Chapter, AIA, is a former Corresponding member, Committee on Allied Arts and formerly served on the National Arbitration Panel.
