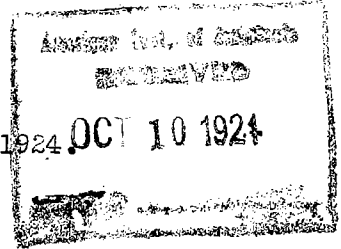

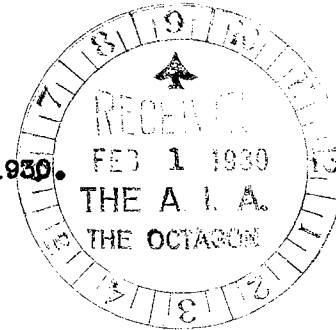

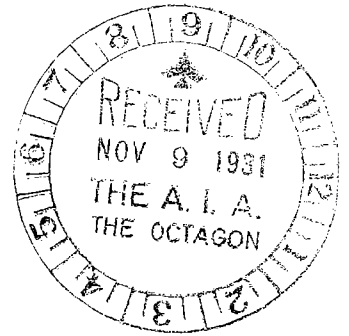

Gentlemen;

During the past summer, Mr. George L Walling, A.I.A. requested that his resignation be presented to the Toledo Chapter and the Institute, in such a way that it would be possible for him to join again at some future time. He is especially anxious that he be permitted to resign in good standing.

It is not necessary for a former member to fill out an application form in order to be readmitted to membership.

A letter may be addressed by him to The Secretary of The Institute requesting reinstatement, stating that he is professionally engaged in the practice of architecture, and transmitting a check covering outstanding indebtedness, with an additional amount of \$25.00. This covers the admission fee (\$5.00) and dues in advance for the first year following reelection (\$20.00).

Upon receipt of such a letter a communication will be sent to the Chapter to which he was assigned requesting that Chapter to certify that the applicant is not indebted to it for dues and that his readmission is recommended, or otherwise, as the case may be.

When the chapter has responded final action can be taken by The Institute.

We note from your letterhead that you are now practicing architecture in Washington, D. C., and unless you maintain your legal residence or have a place of business in Ohio, it will be necessary for you to be assigned to the Washington D. C. Chapter - subject to your reelection to membership in The Institute.

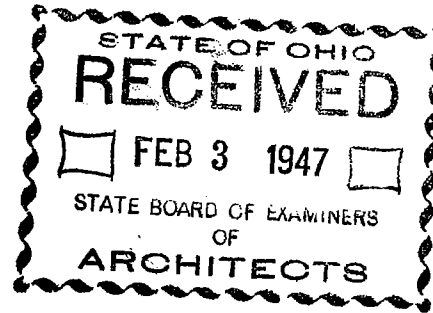



This will confirm our telephone conversation regarding a letter, dated January 13, which you received from Mr. George L. Walling of Austin, Texas.

I have reviewed the correspondence between this office and Mr. Harry D. Payne of Houston, Texas and, apparently, Mr. Walling has not received a satisfactory reply to Mr. Payne's letter of November 29, 1948. On December 4, we replied to Mr. Payne's letter to the effect that we were calling this matter to the attention of the General Accident Assurance Corporation. It would appear that neither Mr. Walling nor Mr. Payne have received a satisfactory reply to Mr. Payne's letter from the insurance company. It is quite possible that the General Accident did not write to Mr. Payne because Mr. J. T. Orr, Superintendent of the Compensation and Liability Underwriting Department of the insurance company is planning a trip to Texas in the near future, however, Mr. Payne's letter should have been at least acknowledged by Mr. Orr.

On January 13, 1949, Mr. Payne very kindly wrote us giving us the names of the new chairman and officers in Houston and in Austin whom we should contact regarding insurance matters. On January 24, we sent a copy of this letter to Mr. Orr and on January 25 Mr. Orr replied that "On my visit to Texas I will arrange to contact the people referred to and upon my return will let you know the results of our discussion." It would appear that Mr. Orr intends to attempt to work out with your representatives and The Casualty Insurance Division of the Board of Insurance Commissioners of the State of Texas a form of policy that will be acceptable to the authorities in Texas, and one that will not be a discrimination against the Architect Corporate Members in the State of Texas.

We can assure you that this office is anxious to make this policy available to your members in Texas. Please assure Mr. Walling that this office will cooperate with him in every way to secure approval of this insurance for members of the Texas Chapter.

Sometime ago Mr. George Walling was in my office with a letter from Maureen Marx in Washington. He had evidently applied for reinstatement to the Institute and had sought her advice in procedures involved.

Mr. Walling was advised by the Octagon that he owed several years dues and was advised to first, pay his national dues and second, apply to the local Chapter for re-admission under whatever conditions the local Chapter deemed appropriate.

I advised Mr. Walling to let me present this matter to the Executive Board and did so at the June 27 meeting. The consensus of the Board was that since Mr. Walling had been a charter member (so I understand) and since we are making a concerted effort to enlist all registered architects in the area, that we should waive his past dues and, subject to satisfaction of the Institute and TSA requirements, be re-admitted as a corporate member.

I understand from Auda Wilkerson that Mr. Walling has not paid dues in '63, '64 or '65 and was dropped by the TSA on 1-20/64 and by the AIA on 2/5/65. We are pleased to receive your inquiry indicating your interest in affiliating with the AIA again.

Process for readmission is the same as for an original applicant with the exception of dues payments: Former members are not permitted to pay dues on the reduced basis in effect for newly elected members. Also, a readmission fee is required and payment for back dues which may be in arrears.



Mr. George Walling, a Corporate member in good standing of this Chapter, has called upon me this week in regards his membership status in the Institute. Mr. Walling was given a year's leave of absence for 1969 to travel in Europe and has returned briefly for a short visit to the States and will return to Europe after his visit is terminated.

Mr. Walling's purpose in calling on me was to inquire as to the possibility of maintaining membership in the Institute, but not getting re-involved in State or Chapter affairs. I thought perhaps it might be a good idea to write to you to inquire if Mr. Walling might be eligible for exemption from dues under the status of Member Emeritus.

Mr. Walling has been a member of the American Institute of Architects since 1924 but for financial reasons, dropped out for a period of two years and was reinstated a little over a year ago. After a period of some months, he requested a leave of absence to make the trip to Europe mentioned above. We realize it is generally not possible for a member who has not been in good standing for at least fifteen years prior to retirement to obtain this exemption from dues. We did feel, however, that due to Mr. Walling's extremely long service and membership in the Institute, that this condition might be lessened since he is not in professional practice at this time and does not intend to re-establish a practice having reached the age of 68 and not feeling capable of handling the affairs of a principal or a partner in a firm. He does think that perhaps from time to time he may do a little work for people on an advisory or consulting basis, but only insofar as it does not affect his retirement status.

It's good to hear from you again. I trust our previous members problems with respect to assignment have been ironed out, at least for the time being.

You indicate in your letter that the Chapter would be willing to recommend that the 15 years of successive membership requirement for membership emeritus be lessened for George Walling. If so, the Secretary of the AIA will no doubt comply and lessen the requirement, as is his custom when a chapter so requests.

With respect to the other conditions which cannot be waived or changed, if it could be said that Mr. Walling is now retired and not engaged in architecture, he may apply for this change in membership status now.

We note your statement that he may do some work on a consulting or advisory basis, but only insofar as it does not affect his retirement status. Such activity could make this a borderline case, but I think his eligibility would have to be judged by his present state of affairs, not what may or what may not happen in the future.

If it cannot be said that Mr. Walling is retired and not engaged in the profession, he may apply when he does meet this condition or when he reaches 70 years of age, in which event it makes no difference whether he is retired or not. If this turns out to be the case, you could make him a member emeritus of the chapter until he qualifies Nationally, and you could even recommend waiver of his dues until he qualifies.
