Coming to the United States in 1919, he became a draftsman in the office of Howell & Thomas, Cleveland architects. He was chief draftsman in the office of Philip L. Small from 1920 to 1928 and a member of the firm from 1928 to 1932.

Since 1933 he practiced architecture under his own name. designing many of the homes in the western suburbs of Cleveland as well as churches and institutional buildings.

At the time of his death he was engaged in one of a long series of major improvements at the Central YMCA building.

Mr. Walters' professional career included a period in 1935 and 1936 as superivising architect for the Home Owners Loan Corp. and a year during World War II in architectural work on Corps of Engineers projects in Kentucky.

He returned to Cleveland to become a member of the Metropolitan Architects firm, designers of the Brooklyn Acres housing development for the Metropolitan Housing Authority.

Specialist in Specifications

He was a specialist in specification writing and was associated for this purpose with the firm of Weinberg & Teare, with which he shared offices in the Citizens Building.

A member of the American Institute of Architects, Mr. Walters was interested in furthering architectural education and taught drawing at John Huntington Polytechnic Institute a number of years.

A resident of Rocky River for nearly 30 years until last fall, he served a term in the '30s on its board of zoning ap-

Mr. Walters is survived by his wife, Hedy, whom he married in 1953.
