



With reference to your election to corporate membership, our records disclose that you previously maintained such membership from 1943 through December 31, 1946, at which time it was terminated for non-payment of Institute dues.

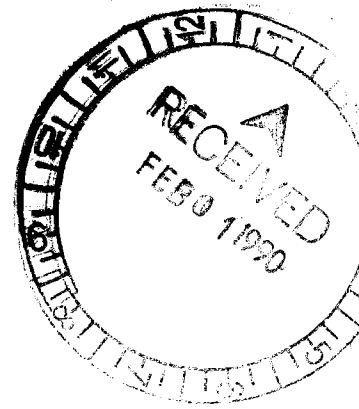
