



SIMON WASSERMANN

Simon Wassermann, a Philadelphia architect, died at Episcopal Hospital there Wednesday. He was 75 years old.

Mr. Wassermann, an architect for 25 years with Harold E. Wagoner & Associates of Philadelphia, was graduated from the University of Pennsylvania with a degree in architecture in 1918.

He was chairman of the board of the Philadelphia chapter of the Americans United for the Separation of Church and State and a member of the Philadelphia Art Alliance and the Philadelphia Museum of the Art
