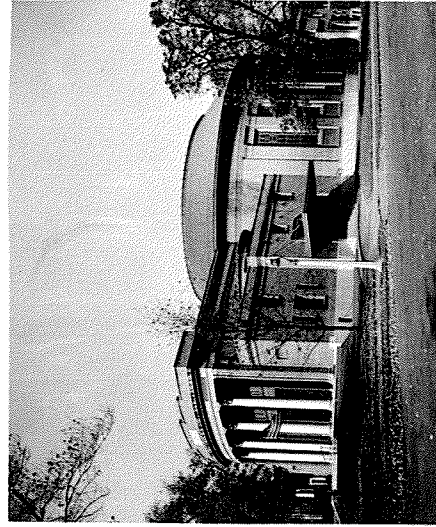
FIRST CHURCH OF CHRIST

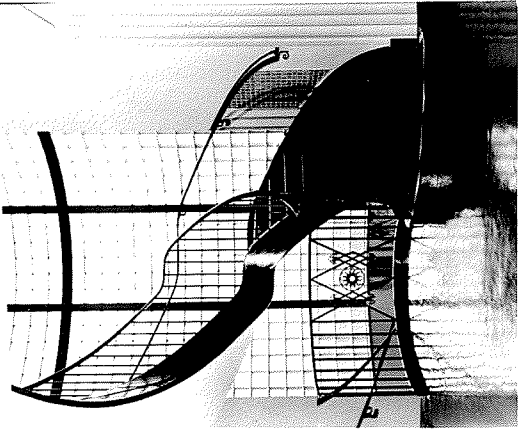

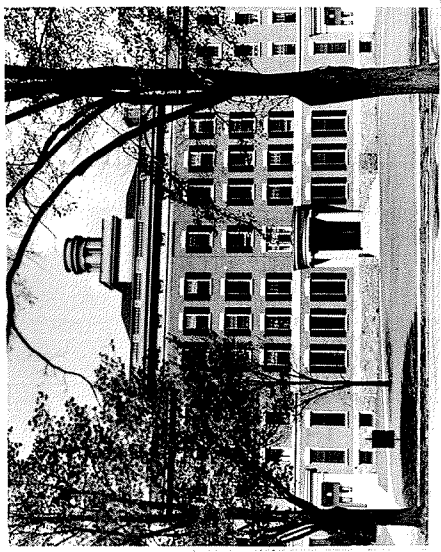

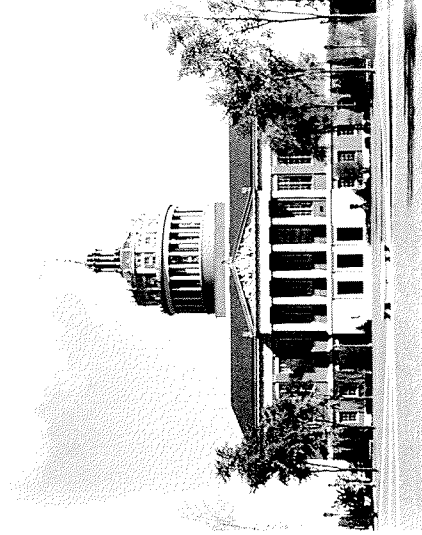
CENTRAL STAIR CASE - MUNRO HALL - WOMEN'S COLLEGE

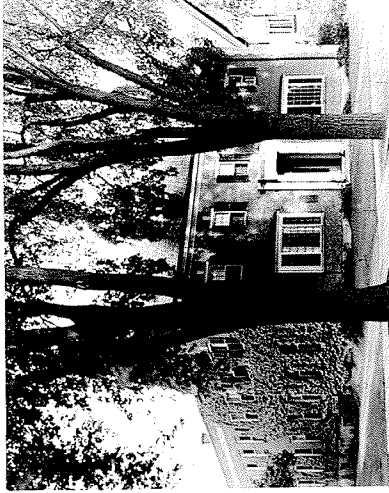

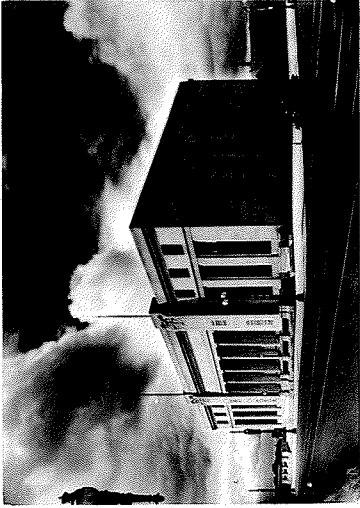


PHYSICIANS BUILDING - 16 NORTH GOODMAN STREET, INC.

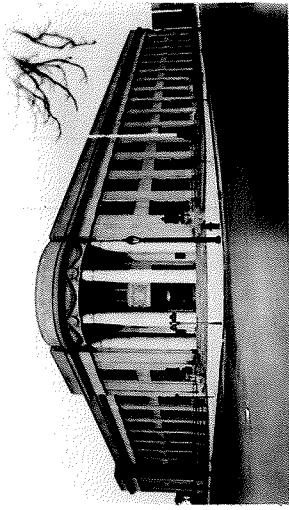

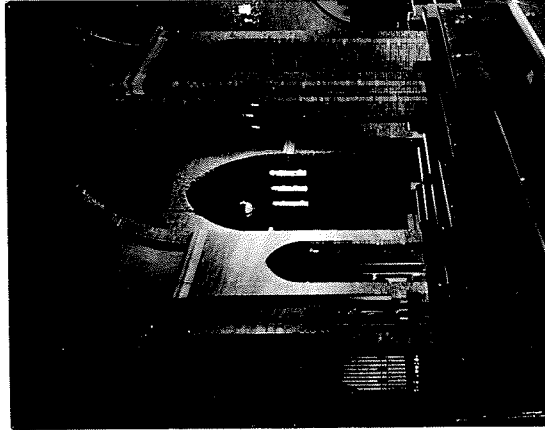
RUNDEL MEMORIAL BUILDING - \$ 1,300,000

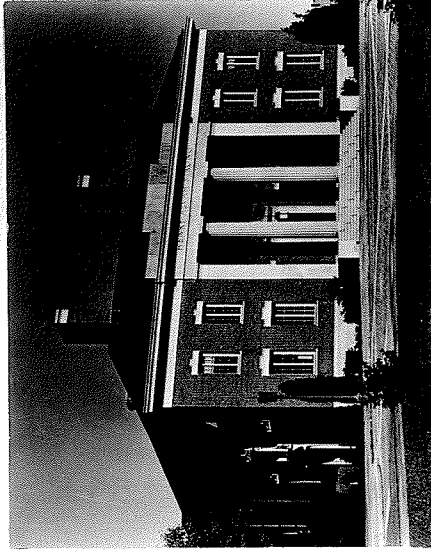
UNITED STATES POST OFFICE BUILDING
