Handicapped Access to Buildings - Architects were disturbed at the package of three bills introduced in the House to make all buildings in the state conform to access standards for the handicapped. Renis Jones of Montgomery and Arthur Joe Grant with the Bureau of Health Facilities Construction met with the committee and were successful in having the bills rewritten to include only state funded buildings and taking out any retroactive clauses.

With the Legislature now to be in session every year, architects are going to have to find a way to keep closer tabs on proposed legislation as well as pressing for legislation of interest to the profession. Two things are certain: it won't be easy and it won't be cheap.

# Prominent City Architect Dies After Long Illness

Clyde C. Pearson, prominent architect and a resident of Montgomery for 64 years, died Monday on his 71st birthday, after an extended illness.

An architect for approximately 35 years, he was a member of the firm of Pearson, Tittle, Narrows and Associates, designers of many buildings in Montgomery, including the civic center presently under construction.

A native of Eclectic, he was a graduate of Sidney Lanier High School and Auburn University. He was a member and former senior war-

den of the Church of the Ascension.

A member of the American Institute of Architects, he was a former president of the Alabama Chapter of the AIA, and regional director of the Gulf States Region of AIA from 1953 to 1956. He was made a Fellow in AIA in 1952.

He was also a former secretary of the State Board for Registration of Architects, a member of the SCARAB Honorary Architectural Fraternity, and a registered architect in 13 states and with the National Council of

Architectural Registration Board.

He was a former president of the Montgomery Chamber of Commerce, the National Auburn Alumni Association and the Kiwanis Club of Montgomery. He was a member of the board of directors of First Alabama Bank of Montgomery and was formerly chief architect for the State Board of Education.

Survivors include his widow, Mrs. Ida Mae Adams Pearson of Montgomery; and a son, Clyde C. Pearson Jr. of Huntsville. (See Death Notices.)
