

 As Regional Member of Chapter & Student Affairs, AIA, I nagged the Chapter Secretaries to get in their reports on time. New England had a perfect record in keeping the Octagon informed as to Chapter Officers, members, etc.
 As member of the Sub-Committee on Student Affairs, I hope that I improved relations and communications between the MIT and Harvard Student Chapters and both the local Chapter and the Octagon.
