Dear Mr. Stotz:

It is with much gratification that we have received your letter of September 26th, transmitting the applications for membership in the Institute on behalf of Robert W. Schmertz and Karl Weber, former Associates of the Pittsburgh Chapter.

The Board of Directors took such action as you quote in your letter, regarding the acceptance of applicants' notes for the Initiation Fee and first year's Annual Dues in advance. We are so advising Messrs. Schmertz and Weber of this provision, and if it would be a convenience to them to take advantage of this method of paying for their initiation fee and dues, we shall be glad to have them do so.

It is noted that both applicants have the Unanimous Endorsement of the Pittsburgh Chapter, which exempts them from the submission of exhibits of work executed by them.

Upon the receipt of their notes or payments for the fee and dues as set forth above, the applications will be complete and ready for submission to the Board of Examiners, and then to the Board of Directors for final action.

A meeting of the Board of Examiners will probably be held in October, and if Messrs. Schmertz and Weber could complete their applications by that time, we would be in a position to secure final approval of their election at the November meetings of the Board or Executive Committee. Otherwise, there will be a delay until the spring meetings.

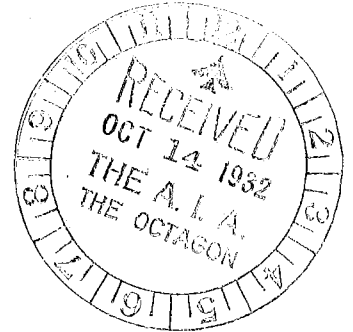
